INVESTIGATION TO BE HELD BY WRA ON FLORIN FIRE

A thorough investigation of damages caused on homes and property of evacuees by the recent fire in Florin, California, will be conducted by WRA evacuee property officers, it was learned this week.

The investigation is being made following reports in newspapers, and from neighbors and friends of evacuees that considerable damages had been incurred on homes of residents here.

With information based upon a WRA press release, the Topaz Times and other camp papers had originally reported that no damage had resulted from this fire.

SEABROOK FARMS HAS JOB OFFERS

The thirty-five thousand acre Seabrook Farms located just outside Bridgeton, New Jersey, have several job openings for issei and nisei men and women, according to Emil Sekerak, relocation office manager.

Headed by C. F. Seabrook, the organization includes the Seabrook Farms, Deerfield Packing Corporation and the Cumberland Warehouse Corporation.

Wages for unskilled labor are 55¢ an hour for men and 50¢ an hour for women. Housing will be provided by the company in Deerfield Village at \$ dollars a week. The rate includes room and board.

The five, all of whom are residents of the Heart Mountain relocation center, are Kiyoshi Okamoto, Paul Takeo Nakadate, Isamu Horino, Utaka Matsumoto and Guntaro Kubota. They were represented by A. L. Wirin, Los Angeles attorney.

The arraignment was presided over by Eugenio Rico, US district judge of Muskogee, Okla. No date has been set for the trial.

The first person from Topaz to enter the services under the Army Specialized Training Program, Jack Yoshizuka of 40-4-CD, left the center yesterday to report to Fort Douglas.

Following 13 weeks of basic training Yoshizuka will be sent to a college or university at government expense to study in a field for which he is qualified. ASTP training, depending upon the course assigned, varies from one to eight 12-week terms.

Yoshizuka is the only one to enter ASTP from Topaz out of some 80 boys who took qualifying tests last March. J. Hugh Turner of the local board #30 stated that several others had qualified for training but have thus far shown no interest in entering ASTP.

If applicants qualify and can be accepted for residence in California by the Western Defense Command, they may depart for Stanford for classes which start September 15, it was indicated.

Mrs. Manwaring, a fluent speaker in Japanese, will leave tomorrow, when she completes her conferences with candidates.

3 Shitara Sisters Given Prison Terms And Charged \$1000; Leniency Plea Made By German Prisoner

DENVER, Colo.--Ignoring her plea for a "double sentence" so her sister might go free to care for their children, US District Judge J. Foster Symes Friday ordered Mrs. Tsuruko (Toots) Wallace, 35, to serve two years in prison and pay a \$1000 fine for conspiracy to commit treason.

The Japanese American woman's two sisters--Mrs. Florence (Flo) Shizuo Ota-ni, 33, and Mrs. Billie Shitara Tanigoshi, 32--drew 20-month terms and \$1000 fines for their part in a plot to aid two German prisoners in their escape last fall from a camp at Trinidad, Colo.

H.W. MADISON CO. WANTS ISSEI AND NISEI WORKERS

The H. W. Madison company of Medina, Ohio, is recruiting both issei and nisei men and women, according to the local relocation office. The company manufactures pickles, mayonnaise, mustard and salad dressing.

Wages will be 65 cents for the first two months for men, then 70 cents per hour. A minimum of 50 hours of work per week is assured with time and a half pay for over 40 hours. Women will be advanced to 52 cents per hour from beginning wages of 47½ cents.

A very careful survey of community acceptance was made by the labor relations adviser of the company as well as the Cleveland WRA office. As a result about 40 prominent leaders of Median, including business men, church people, the superintendent of education and the commander of the local American Legion Post, have welcomed evacuees.

Housing in apartments or trailers are available near the plant.

Medina is located 30 miles south of Cleveland, where about 1000 evacuees are relocated.

last week by a jury that found them innocent of treason charges, which carry a maximum penalty of death. US Marshall A.D. Fairbanks said the sisters likely will be taken in about a week to the federal women's reformatory at Alderson, W. Va.

Acknowledging that the idea was implausible, Robinson told Symes of Mrs. Wallace's request for a "double sentence"--both her own and Mrs. Tanigoshi's. Thus, he explained, she hoped that her sister might be allowed to take care of their children. Mrs. Wallace has a 9-year-old daughter; Mrs. Tanigoshi, a 4-year-old daughter.

A leniency plea for the

sisters was addressed to Symes in a letter written by Herman August Loescher, one of the two Germans, and made public by Assistant US District Atty. Ivor O. Wingren.

"The thought of our helpers being punished is a very bitter one," the prisoner wrote. "Is there really no way for us to milder a possible penalty or to take any influence to the verdict?"

Loescher, who testified against the girls along with the comrade, Heinrich Haider, told Symes that the sisters tried to dissuade them from escaping.

"I think it reasonable to consider us the more guilty party," he said.
