DEPOT CONDITION REINDUCTION RULES FOR INVESTIGATORS DRAFT EFFECTED MEN GIVEN CONFIRM REPORTS

T. Takefuji, who visited the Sioux Ordance Depot, Nebraska, last week, will give a report of the conditions and types of work offered there, according to the relocation office.

Takefuji and N. Takakuwa, both of block 22, spent 3 days at the depot inspecting relocation possibilities there for evacuees.

The Sioux Depot has openings for about 260 to 400 individuals of both sexes, issei or nisei, as civil service employees. Provost Marshall clearance is necessary for these positions.

Men will be used to unload freight cars, stack and store boxes, while the women will work as checkers or fork lift operators. Base pay for munition handlers start at 72 cents per hour and time and half for overtime, with subsequent raises in base pay. Openings are also available for carpenters and machine shop operators.

Details of available housing and facilities provided for the workers may be obtained from Takakuwa at the relocation office.

CO-OP FREIGHT HANDLING UNDECIDED

Negotiations for the handling of freight and express by the Co-op from September 30 have not been completed; according to S. Nozaka, Co-op general manager.

Nozaka stated that the Co-op may not be able to take over this project owing to the existing manpower shortage in the Co-op personnel.

Twenty-four members of the Central Utah School Administrators' Association will meet here Tuesday to study local education problems, according to R. P. Sanford, assistant project director.

The education section staff will be hosts to the delegates who will meet with the teachers here.

The party is headed by Le Roy Bishop, superintendent of the Pintic School district in Eureka county. The group includes 4 district superintendents and 20 school principals.

Both Bankson and Conrad will leave on September 30 for Denver, Colo., to attend a week's conference of reports officers from the various centers, field relocation offices and Washington offices.

Evacuees who have passed pre-induction physical examinations for the armed forces and who wish to return to the center pending call to duty may be reinducted into the center, according to a wire from E.G. Arnold, acting WRA director. If they wish to be visitors, they will be required to pay board and lodging during period of their stay.

Those who have been inducted into the armed forces and assigned to the enlisted reserve will be considered non-paying visitors.

WRA will not generally approve the induction or reinduction into centers of medically discharged servicemen. If such a person wishes to return to the center to help his family relocate, he will be granted a one-month stay on a non-paying visitor basis. After a month's time has expired, he must relocate.

CALIF. RETURN GRANTED R. ADACHI

Ryuji Adachi, 5-12-B, has been granted permission from the Western Defense Command to return to his pre-evacuation home at Redwood City, California, according to the welfare section.

Adachi who has passed his physical for the army will be permitted to reside there until he is called for induction after the expiration of his deferment.

He is an applicant for the position as language drillmaster at the Civilian Affairs School at Stanford University, Palo Alto.

It was also reported that he was the first person from Topaz to be given permission in July to visit his home for business reasons.

DETROIT LEADS BROWNS IN AMERICAN LEAGUE RACE

For the interest of baseball enthusiasts of the center this column brings to their attention the close race for the American League Pennant. As for the National League Pennant race, the St. Louis Cardinals have clinched the pennant by defeating the Boston Braves in a decisive game that ended with a score of 5-4.

In the American League play, the Detroit Tigers are leading the St. Louis Browns by a slim margin of $\frac{1}{2}$ games. The only other contender in the pennant race is the New York Yankees. The Yanks are only four games behind the leading Detroit Tigers.

Hammering out a dozen hits, all but one of them figuring in the scoring, the Detroit Tigers Wednesday handed the New York Yankees their fifth straight loss, 8-2, to shave the Yanks four games off the American League page and virtually snuffed New York pennant hopes. Pitching in the victorious game was Paul "Dizzy" Trout, scoring his 25th pitching victory against a dozen defeats. In the last game of the series with the Tigers, the Yanks fought to win by a close score of 5-4, and in doing so the Yanks won back the chance for the American League Pennant.

Meanwhile Jack Kramer kept the pennant hopes of the St. Louis Browns alive Wednesday night when he turned back the Washington Senators, 5-2, to keep the team a game and a half behind the pace-setting Detroit Tigers. By winning the Thursday game the St. Louis Browns forged ahead to place themselves but a half game behind the formidable Tigers.

The results as of Friday are that Detroit took a double header from the Red Sox of Boston, winning the first game by 7-4 and the second by the score of 8-6; thus placing themselves $\frac{1}{2}$ games ahead of the St. Louis Browns and 4 games ahead of the Yanks.

HAWAII NISEI RATE HIGH IN ITALY SWIMMING MEET

Japanese Hawaiians now fighting in Italy placed high in an Allied Nation's swimming championship meet held recently in Rome, according to a report made by Pvt. Mickey Becket, former Penn State diving ace.

The Fifth Army zone team composed mainly of Japanese Hawaiians and led by Halo Hirose and Charlie Oda, won the championship. Of the meet Becket says, "It was as close as you'd ever want to come to in an Olympics."

Besides assorted American GI's, the contestants included British, French, French-Moroccans, Palestinians, and Yugoslav Partisans.

The climax of the 3-day meet was a water polo exhibition between the North African champion soldiers' team and a team of Yugoslavs, who had been pulled out of the front lines by Marshal Tito. NAD won by 6 goals to 3.

TOPAZ HIGH TO PLAY DELTA FRI.

The Topaz High School eleven opens its football campaign with its first game scheduled to be played against Delta High School at Delta Friday, Sept. 29.

Looking the local team over in its scrimmage practice this morning the team looks as though they will be ready by Friday to hand the Delta eleven their first defeat in the football season.

Pacing the local team on the coaching staff are Yosh Takakuwa, line coach and ex-Topaz player, Sam Yamamoto and Mike Yoshimine, both backfield coaches and former stars for bay region football teams.

AVIATION COURSE AT AIRPORT NORTHEAST OF DELTA OPEN TO 20

Arrangements have been made for twenty Topaz residents to take the Aviation Mechanics Course which is to be given at the Municipal Airport Hangar located northeast of Delta. This course gives training (1) in aircraft engines as follows: theory, maintenance and care in aircrafts engine, lubricating and oiling systems, magneto and ignition systems, carburetor and fuel systems, propeller, and civil aeronautics authority regulations; (2) in aircraft mechanics as follows: aircraft nomenclature, aircraft woodwork, and metal work, fabricating, doping, painting, landing gears of all types, control systems, hydraulic system, sheet metal and riveting, rigging, weights and balance, and cable splicing. The proper use, care and handling of tools and machines are studied.

This course is taught by a mechanic licensed by the US Department of Commerce Civil Aeronautic Authority.

Persons completing this course may be employed as junior mechanics in aircraft industry.

The class is limited to 20 persons. Out of school persons will be given preference. A reading and speaking knowledge of English is essential. Transportation will be furnished to and from the Delta hangar, leaving Topaz at 3 o'clock and returning at 8 o'clock. Class work will be conducted from 4 o'clock to 7 o'clock. Tuition and textbooks are free to persons taking this course.

Those interested should contact immediately the vocational training office, located in the west wing of the auditorium.

Class work begins Oct. 2.
