PREACHING MISSION TO CONCLUDE

With an English and a Japanese Evangelistic Service tonight, the 5-day preaching mission which has been conducted here since Sunday by Dr. Hachiro Yuasa of New York and Dr. J. H. Cobb of Spokane, Washington, will be practically concluded.

CARTER GRANT VISITS

Carter Grant, state department of vocational training official, arrived yesterday to make a final check on the Body and fender course to be held here.

He will also discuss an Out of School Youth and Agriculture program with Perry Carmichael, vocational training director.

Handling of personal freight, express and COD packages between Delta and Topaz has been taken over by the Salt Lake-Delta Freight Line since Monday, it was disclosed yesterday by L.T. Hoffman, project director.

Under the new arrangements the following procedures will be used:

1. The Salt Lake-Delta Freight Line will deliver packages under this classification to the project express at the garage.

2. This office will be open between 12 noon and 1 PM to make deliveries and collections.

3. No deliveries will be made within the center. Each person must make his own arrangements for delivery of items. A cart will be available at the motor pool office to check out for moving heavy packages.

4. Appointive staff members ordering groceries from Delta must have their orders into the store by 9 AM so that the Salt Lake-Delta Freight Line can pick up these orders. Groceries will be unloaded at the administrative warehouse. Delivery charges will be added to the grocery bill.

Residents can expedite delivery of freight and express by having all orders consigned to Topaz instead of to Delta.

15 WORKERS NEEDED AT POULTRY FARM

KOREMATSU AND ENDO CASES DRAFTING OF NISEI TO BE HEARD THIS WEEK IN SLC AREA HITS LABOR SHORTAGE

The United States Supreme Court will hear the Korematsu and Endo cases on Wednesday and Thursday from present indications. The first case on the calendar will be the Korematsu case which will decide the question whether the mass evacuation from the Pacific Coast of all persons of Japanese parentage was constitutional or not. The arguments were expected to start this afternoon.

The Endo case which will define the authority of the War Relocation Authority over citizens of Japanese ancestry who are now living in relocation centers will be argued next, after, most likely on Thursday morning.

Wayne Collins of the Northern California branch of the American Civil Liberties Union is expected to argue the Korematsu case. James Purcell of San Francisco is expected to argue the Endo case. Charles Horsky of Washington, DC, ACLU member, most likely will be allotted some time to argue both cases.

These two test cases, according to the statement of Roger N. Baldwin, director of the ACLU, are the two most important cases pertaining to civil liberties to arise during World War I and World War II.

At a press conference held with the representatives of the New York Times, Herald-Tribune, PM, United Press and World-Telegram, National JACL President Saburo Kido stated that the test cases were the two of the most important cases involving civil liberties since the Civil War.

With no suitable successor at present to replace Ohjiro Numajiri, YMCA co-ordinator here, who is relocating this month to Cincinnati, Ohio, the Topeka YMCA will be closed indefinitely, it was decided at a recent Y Board meeting.

The YMCA dues collected during a membership drive earlier this year will be donated to the Student Aid Fund, it was reported.

MILLER TO DIRECT DENVER WRA OFFICE

DENVER--Charles F. Miller, formerly chief of operations of the War Food Administration here, has been appointed area officer with headquarters in Denver. Territory under the Denver office includes Colorado, New Mexico, and parts of Montana, Wyoming, North and South Dakota, Texas and Nebraska.

Malcolm E. Pitts, as field assistant director, headed the Denver area office until his transfer to Washington, DC, several months ago as assistant national director of the WRA.

Miller was chief of the farm labor supply section of the Farm Security Administration. He is a native of Flint, Mich., but has been a Denver resident for 21 years.

Salt Lake county's Japanese American farmers who a year ago were untouched by a farm labor problem, are beginning to feel the effect of the army's decision last January to induct Japanese Americans. V.L. Martineau, county agricultural agent, pointed out Monday.

The county's 100 nisei farmers, most of whom operate truck farms, have employed Japanese Americans or Japanese. With the induction of the draft-age nisei, the farmers are feeling the labor squeeze, Martineau said.

"We have never had any difficulty with the Japanese Americans," Martineau stated. "They are good farmers and hard workers."

The county's nisei farmers rent farms. Most of them come from California, where they followed a similar occupation. Before the war, Salt Lake county had only 20 farms operated by Japanese Americans as compared to the present 100 farms.

The farms are run on a family basis. Usually, Martineau said, they are rented by a Japanese American who with his children or parents raise truck crops.

MOVIE PATRONS COMPLAIN TO SSAF

Some complaint has been voiced of the SSAF benefit movie, "The Fight Between Light and Darkness", last week end, according to Satsato Yamate, scholarship fund committee chairman. Many persons had expected to see a "chan bari" picture, a story of medieval Japanese warriors, and still others expected to see a picture with all-Japanese background and scenery.

Yamate stated that he and the committee were disappointed in the fact that the film was not up to expectations and expressed his regrets to the patrons of the movie.

EVACUEE HATER CHANGES MIND, SUPPORTS CAPPE

"When I'm wrong I'll admit it, and I was wrong", said George L. Kelly who until recently was chairman of the "Ban the Japanese Committee" in Pasadena. Kelly, who admitted he was "just an unpredictable Irishman", resigned from his own committee which for the past several weeks has bombarded the Board of Education, President Roosevelt, Gov. Dewey and Gen. Bonesteel with petitions protesting the enrollment of Esther Takei, 19-year-old nisei, at Pasadena Junior College.

He applied for membership in the Pasadena Chapter of the Committee for American Principles and Fair Play after being invited to attend one of their meetings. He said, "That Dillon Myer fellow convinced me. Why, I have always felt just like they do only I didn't know it. They practice civil rights. At that meeting the people I'd been bucking invited me to sit on the platform with them."

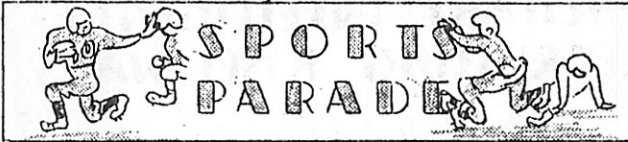
The first thing the children did as their parents moved in was to open

COMMISSARY DOWNED BY CAS AIR ATTACK, 7-0

The CAS gridders took to the air in the final stanza and with Sus Ota pitching perfect strikes to his receivers, marched from their opponents' 40 yard stripe to pay dirt on three passes to down the Commissary eleven, 7 to 0, Saturday afternoon on the high school gridiron. Sam Yamamoto connected a toss to Mike Yoshimine for the extra conversion point.

From the opening minutes of play, it was evident that the Storekeepers were greatly missing the services of Tachi Tanaka, plunging fullback, who was instrumental in the Commissary's victory over the CAS in their last encounter.

The following are a few of the rules:

RAMS SLAUGHTER HINCKLEY, 63-6

The Topaz Ram football squad went on a scoring rampage to completely smother the helpless Hinckley men under a 63 to 6 blanket in a 6-man football game Monday on the loser's field.

The locals substituted freely by replacing 6 men at a time.

Tackling will not be permitted. The ball is declared dead when a defensive player touches runner between his head and knees with both hands. 15 yard penalty for tackling.

Blocking must be done without the use of hands or extended arms. The blocker's feet must be in contact with the ground during the block. 15 yard penalty for illegal blocking by offense or defense.

All players are eligible to receive passes. The passer must be at least 3 yards behind scrimmage.
