



EXCLUSION OF SEVEN RESIDENTS INJURED JAPANESE FROM SAT. IN TRUCK ACCIDENT COAST PETITIONED

Attorneys General of California, Oregon and Washington petitioned the Supreme Court on October 7 to lift, as soon as national security permits, civilian exclusion orders against persons of Japanese ancestry issued by military authorities in the West Coast area after Pearl Harbor.

The attorneys, filing a joint petition as friends of court in the case of Fred T. Korematsu which is testing the legality of the evacuation order, said the high tribunal has emphasized in decisions handed down previously that except in most unusual circumstances racial discriminations are prohibited.

The petition from the three state attorneys states that "it was reasonable for the military commanders to meet the danger threatened from the unidentified members of the group by excluding the group as a whole."

They further stated that there is no evidence showing that the evacuation was motivated by pressure from anti-Japanese groups opposed to the Japanese for racial and economic reasons, who secured the removal under the cloak of war pressure.

JAPAN PLANS HELP TO REPATRIATES

That government authorities in Manchukuo are planning to help recent repatriates from the United States to Japan was indicated through a radio Tokyo broadcast picked up Saturday by Federal Communications monitors.

The broadcast in English to Western United States said,

"Former residents of the United States who returned to Japan aboard the steamship Toia Maru will (one word missing) a village in Manchukuo. The government authorities in Manchukuo are making preparations to accord every courtesy to the new settlers.

Seven Topaz men were injured in the overturning of a truck bringing 11 men back from the gravel pit northwest of the project late Saturday.

Most seriously injured and still hospitalized today, are Nakanosuke Tanaka, 8-9-C, head injury; Tomejiro Hochizuki, 8-6-F, fractured heel; and Kaichiro Namba, 34-4-C, face lacerations.

Chosai Shinoda, 39-6-E; Tsunco Kiuchi, 39-5-D; J. Obayashi, 34-8-D; and Akio Ujihara, 34-12-F; were treated at the project hospital for minor cuts and bruises.

Shigeru Tamura, 4-12-A; Yoshio Nishimoto, 34-3-CD; Jitsuzo Akiyoshi, 20-9-B; and Buichi Nakata, 42-4-B. Other passengers in the truck escaped injury.

The accident occurred on a curve about a mile north of the project's northwest boundary. R.W. Roof, chief internal security officer, said the driver, Yukio Yamauchi, 34-7-B, told him that he lost control in swerving to avoid a rock.

CAREY McWILLIAMS WRITES NEW BOOK

"Projudice, Japanese Americans; Symbol of Racial Intolerance," Carey McWilliams published last week by Little, Brown and Company urges the lifting of the military ban excluding persons of Japanese ancestry from the West Coast, according to newspaper and magazine reviews this week.

In his book McWilliams suggests a four point plan for relieving the racial problem. He urges congress to adopt a public policy that there shall be no discrimination based upon race, color, creed, or national origin, and to insure this in the form of a Fair Racial Practices Act.

"REMEMBER PEARL HARBOR" JUDGES ANNOUNCE LEAGUE RAPPED BY MYER FIRE PREVENTION CONTEST WINNERS

SEATTLE, Oct. 12--Dillon S. Myer, director of the WRA, today admonished the "Remember Pearl Harbor" League organized by farmers who oppose the removal of evacuated Japanese to "let those who want to fight go overseas to do it."

At a conference with Corydon Garrett, Sumner, Wash., newspaperman and spokesman for the recently organized league, Myer declared that returning war veterans "are going to be particular about what liberties are taken with our constitution."

Garrett remarked that the league wanted "to save fighting the Japanese later."

"I'm not afraid that there is going to be bloodshed, D. Myer said. "At the most we may expect only a few isolated incidents created by hotheads who have been drinking too much."

"I understand your organization advocated taking their citizenship away from these people," Myer told Garrett. "When you do that you are monkeying with your own citizenship and mine, and I don't care for that."

Myer said he believed the friction was mostly economic, and that sponsors of the league feared competition offered by the Japanese who before the war were prominent in the truck farming industry in the White River and Puyallup valleys where the league was formed.

"They forget we have some 12,000 Japanese Americans fighting with our armies, some of them in the South Pacific," he said. "In one relocation center recently we had 46 gold star mothers whose sons had been in action. In one battalion there were 54 holders of silver stars and more than 1000 men with The Purple Heart."

Colonization Plan For Residents Unable To Leave Centers Suggested

A plan for an extensive co-operative colonization for relocation center residents who cannot leave the centers for the duration was suggested in a 6-page report sent by three residents of Rohwer to Secretary of Interior Ickes; WRA Director Dillon Myer, and other WRA officials, it was reported by Louise Suski of Chicago in the Heart Mountain Sentinel.

This report suggests that the government invest \$45,000,000 for three colonies in the form of a loan to be paid back in 30 years. The government is also to furnish all building material, farming equipment, and land improvement.

The plan proposes the allotment of 10 acres per

\$1000 CARNEGIE INSTITUTE PRIZE AWARDED TO YASUO KUNIYOSHI

PITTSBURG--First prize of \$1000 in the annual Carnegie Institute exhibition of "Painting in the United States" went Friday to a Japanese American, Yasuo Kuniyoshi of New York, for his sophisticated still life painting, "Room 110".

The prize winner, adjudged best of 311 entries, depicts a group of unrelated items suspended from a plaster cast and resting on a tilted table top against a backdrop of a glass fronted office door.

Of the awarding of this prize to a Japan born artist who has lived in the US since he was 13 years old, the San Francisco Chronicle made the following editorial comment:

Japanese ancestry that the Army's 1942 evacuation of Pacific coastal areas was not a military necessity were "a neat bit of fancy dancing".

Fahy told the Supreme Court that the Army's action was "one of the defense measures taken internally in this great war."

"The federal government stands four-square and indivisible behind the constitutionality of this program," he said.

Attorneys Wayne M. Collins, San Francisco, and Charles Horsky of Washington, appealed to the court in arguments yesterday to hold the exclusion orders invalid and restore the citizenship rights of the 70,000 Japanese Americans thus evacuated.

On the basis of a report by Lt. Gen. J.L. DeWitt, commander of the area in 1942, to Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson, they said that DeWitt had exceeded his authority and that the evacuations were based on "no rational facts" as a military precaution.

The attorneys argued on behalf of Fred Toyosaburo Korematsu and Mitsuye Endo, California-born Japanese now detained in WRA centers.

Authority to carry out the program was given military authorities by the President and by Congress, Fahy asserted. The government "seeks no scapegoat" as to authority for the evacuation program.

"The government desires to stand or fall on the constitutionality of these orders and not on the squeamish approach to this case that someone has exceeded his authority," the Solicitor General said.

LDS HOSPITAL WANTS 3 JANITORS

Three janitors are immediately needed at the L. D. S. Hospital in Salt Lake City. Room and board is provided at the hospital, with \$85. a month for salary.

We doubt whether the Japanese would accord such a distinction to a member of an alien race under the circumstances. But that is a tribute to, not a reflection upon what we call our domestic civilization.

The award is not propaganda. It would be idle to attempt thus to affect Japanese psychology. And Kuniyoshi has exhibited with distinction for 14 years, although this is his first "first".

The distinguished artists who were judges of the contest were able to lay aside prejudice and deal justly with an individual. It is an example of fair play for citizens in more mundane activities than painting pictures.

畜牛部は、只今約九百頭位の牛を持つてゐるが、これれ人牛は充分とは云へない。若い者揃ひで、よく活動してゐるが、幸ひ同部には、農事部長の「パルマー氏」アダムス氏の浅野氏を始め、相當の智識を持つ者が居るので、業績上が、他センター同位にも、更質件内を供給してゐる。調へに依り、本年度米園農事

は、全体として、作物は、全休から、豫想は昨年より大部減る、するならんとのことである。

センターとしては、出来るだけ自給自足の方式で進み、食糧だけは、どうか困らぬようにしたいとは、農事部の意向である。
