PAY CHECKS FOR SEPT. DELAYED IN SALT LAKE

The finance section has been advised that the checks will be released to the project within the next few days and will immediately place them in the pay station for release to the workers.

The section head will be notified by the finance section when checks for their section's workers are available so they may avoid making any unnecessary trips to the pay station.

SEABROOK OFFERS TRANSPORTATION

Transportation will be furnished on a special car as far as Philadelphia if 25 or more persons sign up by October 31 to work for Seabrook Farms, near Bridgeton, New Jersey.

The transportation being provided by Seabrook Farms is an unusual offer since persons normally leaving on trial indefinite leave are required to pay for their own transportation.

INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTES TO CO-OPERATE WITH WRA

The American Federation of International Institutes, formerly known as the National Institute of Immigrant Welfare, is prepared to co-operate with the War Relocation Authority in the resettlement of evacuees and assist in their social and community adjustment. Local agencies affiliated with the Federation are: International Institutes, Immigrants' Protective League, Citizenship Council and Americanization League.

Through its affiliated International Institutes, Leagues and Councils in many cities, it wishes to help evacuees make a successful adjustment in the communities where they resettle.


The institutes are prepared to welcome the newcomers and offer such services as any newcomer in a community needs for making a good adjustment. They have a counseling and guidance service to help with personal problems. They will be glad to make contacts in respects to housing, employment, health, church, activities, recreational activities, as well as with community groups. Their facilities may be used for social, religious and educational gatherings. Arrangements can be made for classes in English or subjects of special interest.

They will also work with existing co-operating committees and on request to help in organizing new co-operating committees.

They are ready to serve as a center of distribution of literature and arrange broadly representative conferences for purposes of community education, both prior to the opening of a community to evacuees and after the arrival of evacuees in a community.

A list of International Institutes in the various communities throughout the United States can be secured at the relocation building.

By the Topaz Future Planning Commission

(Editor's note: This is the first of a series of weekly articles from the Topaz Future Planning Commission.)

The Future Planning Commission, which meets weekly with the Project Director, is composed of representatives of the Community Council; the Block Managers, the Co-operative, the American Red Cross, the Inter-Faith Ministerial Association; the Ladies Auxiliary Protestant Church, the Topaz Protestant Church, the Buddhist Church, the Fellowship Circle, PTA, the USO, and the Business and Professional Women.

The function of this committee is to discuss the future plans of the evacuees and to relay to the center residents first-hand information concerning any new developments which may affect their future plans.

Everyone should start now to think seriously of his own and his family's future--what he would want most to do in any case, and what definite plans he can make toward that goal in the next few months.

If he is waiting to return to the coast, he might open correspondence with former employers, friends and neighbors on the coast. He should take account of property on coast; check into the state of all leases, business equipment, etc., and get in touch with former business associates. The evacuee property officer stands ready to help in these matters.

If he feels that there is better chance for him and his family in the east and other sections of the country, he should be seeking possible localities for his business opportunities; for good living for his family in a normal community and weighing his assets and liabilities for this type of relocation.

HOG CHOLERA BREAKS OUT, PREVENTIVE ACTION TAKEN

The groom, a graduate of the University of California and later post-graduate student at the University of Nebraska, is at present employed in Detroit, Michigan, where the newly-weds will make their home. Mrs. Mukai was employed by the adult education section until recently.

A reception was held at the church after the wedding with 150 friends and relatives attending.

HELPER CAFE NEEDS 5 WOMEN WORKERS

Five girls or women are needed by the Helper Cafe in Helper, Utah, according to its owner K. Kaneshige who is now visiting the project. The women will work as waitresses for 8 hours per day, 6 days a week at \$25 a week.

Meals will be furnished free and living quarters can be obtained in a hotel at \$20 per month. No experience is required.

If married women wish to apply for this job their husbands can be given jobs in the kitchen, Kaneshige states. He can be contacted at 1-2-B until Monday.

NOBLE TO SPEAK

"Democratic Principles and the Rights of Citizens as They Involve Japanese and Other Minorities" will be the title of an address to be given by LeGrande Noble, superintendent of education, before the Utah Educators' Association which will meet in Salt Lake City next week.

The conference theme will be "Education for Understanding".

Hog cholera has broken out on the project farm but there is no danger of infection, Project Director Hoffman said today.

Infected hogs will be destroyed. Some fat hogs in healthy condition will be taken to Hinkley for slaughter to avoid the possibility that they might become infected. All remaining hogs will be vaccinated with serum.

"The meat of cholera infected hogs will not transmit the disease to human beings even if it was eaten instead of destroyed," Hoffman said. The first animals became ill last Friday. The difficulty first was diagnosed an enteritis.

The state veterinarian and a veterinarian from Spanish Fork arrived here Thursday and confirmed suspicions that the disease was hog cholera. All the hogs raised on the project had been vaccinated with a cholera vaccine but this apparently did not provide complete protection, Hoffman said.

RAMS COUNTER TWICE

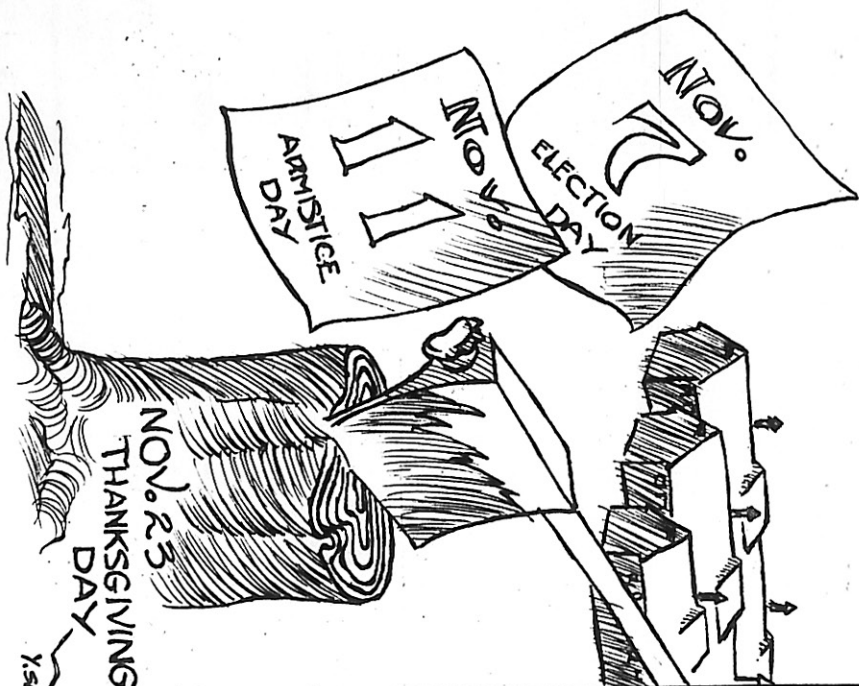

最近のシートル通信を避けんとして欲するに依れば、華府中央転住のマイヤー氏は、先日シートル市に於て日系人の西部沿岸帰還に反対する同地方の農業家連に依り組織された「パールハーバー」なる協會の代弁人たる同市の新聞記者コリドン・キヤレット氏と會見の際、同協会の排日的不穩なる態度を誠めて「戦を好む人々は眞珠満ちるな」に出で戦ふべきである。又關く處に依れば、君らの協會で彼ら日系市民の市民権利奪を唱道して居るとの事なるが、若し諸君にして斯くの如き事を爲すとせば、夫れは吾ながら諸君自身の市民権を奪つて又我輩の市民権を奪つて居ることと等しい。

こと、なり吾らが到底賛同し得ざる處である。又此の軋轢は元來経済的原因から發したもので、殊に此の協會が出來て居る處のホワイトリヴァー及びピヤロップパルバー地方には、戦争教養が日系人等が小作農家として著しく發展して居た所である關係上、今此協會の設立發起人は今後若し日系人等が同地に歸還する時は、又も彼等との競争を恐れて居るからである。尚ほ彼等排日主動者達は現在我軍隊中には二万余余の日系市民兵が協力して米國の爲めに奮闘して居るのである。或日系市民兵等は太平洋戦線に於て日本軍に對して戦つて居ることを忘れてはならない。

又最近の調査に依れば、或る一ヶ所の駐在所に於て其の息子等を戦地に送り、ゴルトスター表彰を授けられたる日系人の母が四十六名も居たのである。而して又日系兵士の一戦闘部隊に特功勳章(シールドスター)を授けられた者が五十四名も在り、又負傷した紫心章を授けられた者も若干名以上に達して居ると語られたることである。
