(Editor's note: This is the first of a series of weekly articles from the Topaz Future Planning Commission.)

The Future Planning Commission, which meets weekly with the Project Director, is composed of representatives of the Community Council; the Block Mena-Council; the Co-operative, gers, the American Red Cross, the Inter-Faith Ministerial Association; the Ladies Auxiliary Protestant Church, the Topaz Protestant Church, the Buddhist Church the Fellowship Circle, PTA, the USO, and the Business and Professional

The function of this committee is to discuss the future plans of the evacuees and to relay to the center residents firsthand information concerning any rew developments which may affect their future plans.

Everyone should start now to think seriously of his own and his family's future -- what he would want most to do in any case, and what definite plans he can make toward that goal in the next few months.

If he is waiting to return to the coast, he might open correspondence employers, former wi th friends and neighbors on the best. He should take account of property on coast; check into state of all leases, business equipment, etc., and get in touch with former business associates. evacuee property officer stands ready to help in these matters.

If he feels that there is better chance for him and his family in the cast and other sections of the country, he should be secking possible localities for his business opportunities: for good living for his family in a normal community and weighing his assets and liabilities for this type of relocation.

Hog cholera has broken out on the project farm but there is no danger of infection, Project Director Hoffman said today.

Infected hogs will be destroyed. Some fat hogs in healthy condition will be taken to Hinckley for slaughter to avoid the possibility that they might become infected. All remaining hogs will be vaccinated with serum.

"The meat of cholera infected hogs will not transmit the disease to human beings even if it was eaten instead of destroyed, Hoffman said. The first animals became ill last Friday. The difficulty first was diagnosed an enteristis.

The state veterinarian and a veterinarian from Spanish Fork arrived here Thursday and confirmed suspicions that the disease was hog cholera. All: the hogs raised on the project had been vaccinated with a cholera vaccine but this apparently did not provide complete protection, Hoffman said.


