ONE SERVICEMAN KILLED, TWO MISSING IN ACTION IN FRANCE

One serviceman was killed and two others are missing in action in France, according to a report received today. Sgt. Ken Mizokami, age 24, was reported killed on November 13 while fighting with the 442nd Infantry, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kumazo Mizokami of 41-1-D were notified yesterday.

Sgt. Mizokami was inducted into the armed forces on November 3, 1941 and received his training at Camp Roberts, California and Camp Robinson, Arkansas, before being sent overseas in April, 1944. He was given the sharpshooter's award and good conduct ribbon.

Two other brothers, Pvts. Roy and Dick, are also in the service. Pvt. Roy Mizokami was reported as wounded in Italy several months ago. Other family members of the late soldier are three brothers, Ben, Dan, Bob; and three sisters, Sally, Mrs. Tomi Nishiyama, and Mrs. Grace Nishiyama. The family formerly lived in Monterey, California.

Seven of the ten soldiers killed in action were volunteers for the army. They are Pfc. Joe Hisato Kato, Pvt. Teruo Tabata, S/Sgt. John Harano, Pvt. Yutaka Kozumi, Pvt. Tom Misumi, Pfc. Nobu Kajiwara, and Pfc. Takanori Nishi.

All except Pfc. Kato had volunteered last year for the combat team of Japanese American soldiers.

Others killed in action were inducted by selective service before Pearl Harbor or the evacuation. These include, Pfc. Kunio Hattori, Sgt. Ken Mizokami, and Pfc. Robert Hoshino.

Topaz Casualties To Be Honored Tomorrow

The first camp-wide memorial service honoring soldiers from Topaz, killed, missing and wounded in action on the Italian and French fronts will be held here tomorrow afternoon at the auditorium. The service will begin from 2:30 o'clock.

To be honored at the military service are 10 servicemen killed in action, 16 wounded and 2 missing. Of the total casualties of 28, all but one, were fighting with the 442nd Infantry Battalion. Five men were killed in Italy and five others were killed in France.

Chairman for tomorrow's service will be Takashi Tsuzuki. Taking an important part in conducting the ceremony will be the Arthur L. Cahoon Post #89 American Legion of Delta.

BY THE FUTURE PLANNING COMMISSION

We believe that there are many persons in the center who lack only a few quarters of covered employment to qualify for Old Age and Survivors Insurance benefits under the Social Security Program. Any person who believes that he or she might be eligible for benefits under this program having had social security deductions from his or her past wages and needing only few more quarters of employment to qualify for these benefits should discuss his case with a welfare worker at 2-9-F.

Any issei who is interested in the Sioux Ordnance Depot employment should know that the War Department has stated that there is no prohibition against aliens of an enemy country participating in essential war activity (Under the Geneva rules of war). International Law further decrees that they may not be expatriated or otherwise penalized by their mother country for such participation.

The federal program of Social Security is something each resident should study and understand. It is something which covers a multitude of big and little emergencies in the lives of those who live in this country and is designated to help us all over periods of financial stress due to old age, unemployment, sickness, and other afflictions we may encounter outside the center.

CALIF. HOSTILITY TO NISEI LESSENS DECLARES BALDWIN

SAN FRANCISCO--"Hostility of Californians to the return of loyal Japanese Americans seems to be ebbing, as this prejudice is being recognized by more people as part of the old West Coast anti-Oriental complex and not associated with the war to the extent assumed," states Roger N. Baldwin, national director of the American Civil Liberties Union at a press conference Sunday.

He explained that this was his observation after a week in California on a nation-wide speaking tour.

The mass evacuation from the coast had one good result, according to Baldwin--Japanese Americans were spread throughout the country, thus easing considerably the problem of assimilation.

In his speech to 150 members of the Friends Center, he said, "It is a fact not foreseen by the prophets before the war that the issue of racial quality before the law has emerged as the major aspect of civil liberties, growing out of the impact of a war for democratic ends.

"The most devastating Axis propaganda among the darker peoples has been directed against the United Nations' racial practices of white supremacy, and the imperialist system which accompanies them, as demolishing their claim of fighting the war for democracy and the four freedoms.

"At home the Negro is conducting an unprecedented campaign for his full share in our democracy with two objectives, victory over the Axis and over white prejudice."

EBIHARA FIRST JAPANESE NATIONAL TO VOLUNTEER

CLEVELAND--Nearly two years ago 24-year-old Tokyo-born Henry Ebihara wrote to President Roosevelt and asked for "a

chance to fight to preserve the principles that I have been brought up on and which I will not sacrifice at any time."

On November 26, Ebihara had his request granted, for he is the first of his race in the United States to volunteer under a new War Department ruling which permits Japanese nationals to enlist in the army.

Ebihara, a war worker in Cleveland since he left Topaz, Utah, last year, said he expects to be called up soon for a physical examination preliminary to his induction.

"I want to go to the China theater and fight the Japanese Fascists," he said.

Asked whether he would find it difficult to fight against his people, Ebihara said:

"I don't regard this war as a fight of one race against another. It is a war of ideals and principles, of democracy against fascism. The latter must be wiped out and I want to do my part of that job."

Ebihara was brought to the United States by his parents when he was 2 years old but he maintains he is "American in thought, American in act--as American as any other citizen."

He grew up in New Mexico and attended New Mexico State College for nearly two years.

(Editor's note: Henry Ebihara's letter to President Roosevelt pleading for a chance to enlist for active duty has been reprinted in the Pacific Citizen, Trek, and more recently in Caroy McWilliams' book "Prejudice--Japanese Americans, Symbol of Intolerance". The letter was written in February, 1943, when nisei volunteers for the army to train for combat duty were being recruited in the relocation centers.

While in Topaz, Ebihara worked in the documentation section of the reports division.)

MP CANTEEN OPEN TO ERC

The army canteen at the Military Police post will be open daily except Sundays from 12:30 to 2 PM to members of the enlisted reserve corps, Lt. Edward Gallagher announced today. They may utilize the canteen's services by showing their ERC card.

Nisei soldiers home on furlough can make purchases at the canteen any time it is open, the same as at their post canteen.

Sioux Deferment Policy Explained

Sioux Ordnance Depot at Sidney, Nebraska has a very liberal policy for requesting draft deferments, recruiters who are now here from the depot stated. A request for deferment is made by Sioux Ordnance before a person actually begins to work. It is made as soon as a person applies to work there.

As soon as an application to work is made, the relocation office informs the depot officials of the applicant's draft status, board number and location. Sioux depot then writes immediately to his board with a request that no action be taken in regard to the applicant, pending his clearance by the provost marshal general's office. This stops either induction or changes in classification.

If the applicant is accepted for employment, a deferment is requested in the usual channels.

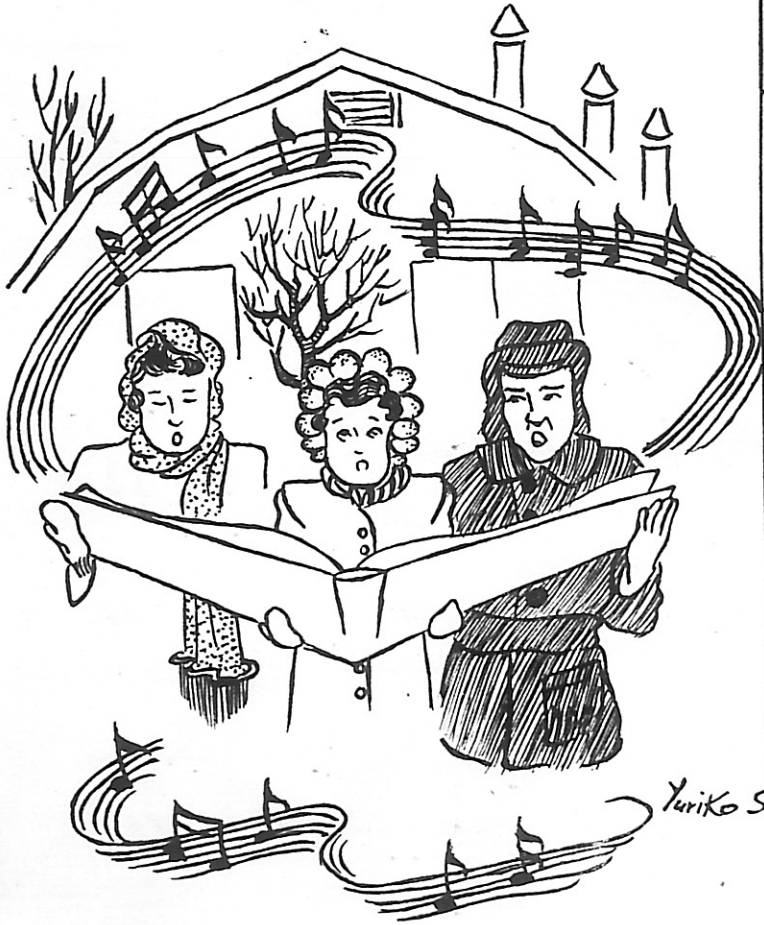

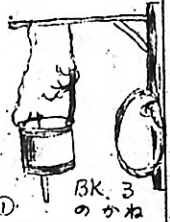
