### 33 ISSUED PERMITS STATE EDUCATION ADVISORY BOARD RE-ENTER PACIFIC COAST TO VISIT FRIDAY

State Advisory Board on Education will visit the schools of Topaz on December 22. This board is comprised of Charles H. Skidmore, superintend nt of education; Pres. F.S. Harris of Brigham Young University, state superin-tendent of public instructions, Dr. John Carlisle, professor of cducation at the Utah State Agricultural College, William J. Starley, manager of Steven's store in Delta and Superintendent A.M. Maughn of Millard County.

These men were approved by the State Board of Education at the time the WRA was first organized. They are all eminent men in the field of education and their services in the past have proven invaluable, Dr. LeGrande Noble, superintendent of education, said.

They will visit all the schools while here, and in the afternoon they will meet with the education staff for the purpose of discussing problems and offering suggestions.

## EVACUATION TRAGIC CASUALTY BALDWIN

SALT LAKE CITY -- The most tregic and far-reaching casualty of minority rights on the home front was the wholesale evacuation of the entire population of Japanese ancestry from the Pacific Coast, allegedly on grounds of military nccessity, but raclearly on grounds of cial prejudice, Roger N. Baldwin, director, American Civil Libertics Union of New York, told members of the JACL at a luncheon I meeting held Friday.

The Western Defense Command Monday issued exempproclamations tions from prohibiting persons of Japanese ancestry from the Pacific Coast states 33 residents of this center. The issuing of permits to 33 persons to enter the restricted area is the largest number to be released at any one time,

The telegram states:

"This Telegram is to advise you that you are exempt from all of those provisions pertaining exclusively to persons of Koutei Sugaya of 31-8-E, Japanese ancestry contained in the proclamations ilian restriction orders heretofora issued by the Commanding General, CMA, Western Defense command. Certificates of exemption follows by mail. The wire was signed by Maj. Gen. Robert H. Lewis, acting commander of the Western Defense Command.

For the first time the list of exempted persons included alien relatives of servicemen.

As nearly as can be ascertained most of the seve en families issued permits have some member fighting in the armed forces.

Although statements could not be obtained from all persons granted permits, several have said that they were not planning to leave here until next year.

# WASHINGTON OFFICE SENDS PITTSBURGH VETS WARNING AGAINST FIRE

Recent fires in some of the centers where the cause was traced to heating appliances, mostly stoves which are too close to woodwork, and to the storage of combustibles under buildings was responsible for a special letter of warning from the Washington office.

The letter from E. J. Pennsylvania Avenue. Utz, chief of operations in Washington, states:

"Stoves or heating appliances were installed too close to walls or combustible materials. The locations in which the fires ventilated shields of asbestos-board, but the shields were nailed direcly to the studs at a point very near the heating appliance. Air-space had been provided at other points. Fires started at the point where the ventilated-shields were nailed to the studding.

"Nood, kindling and other combustible materials stored under buil'dings in considerable quantity. This contributed to the spread of fire and hindered fire-fighting operations.
