TRAIN SCHEDULES TO CALIF. GIVEN

Residents leaving for California may take three different trains from Salt Lake City or Ogden.

The Pacific Limited (Tr. #21) leaves Ogden at 5 AM (Mt. Time) and arrives in San Francisco at 6:50 AM (Pac. Time). Challenger (Tr. #87) leaves Ogden at 11:35 PM (Mt. Time) and arrives in San Francisco at 10:50 AM (Pac. Time). The Western Pacific train leaves Salt Lake at 7:30 AM (Mt. Time) and arrives in San Francisco at 8:50 AM (Pac. Time).

All trains arrive in Sacramento $4\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 hours and Oakland 40 minutes to an hour before reaching San Francisco.

The train leaving Delta at 2:33 PM (Mt. Time) arrives in Salt Lake City at 6:30 PM and in Ogden at 8:40 PM.

DISCHARGED NISEI VETERANS AT TOOELE KEEP HELPING WAR EFFORT

TOOELE--They were clustered around a buzz saw which they were rebuilding from the parts of two old, worn-out saws. Even to the casual observer it was obvious they knew their job well, that they were experienced mechanics who would soon have a new saw operating.

"They really do wonderful work," commented Capt. Anthony A. Mrous who is in charge of the Tooele Ordnance Depot Third Echelon Shop where the rebuilding

was in progress. "They're fine mechanics."

The three men of whom he spoke were Tom Yamamoto, John Miyamoto and Yoshio Hamatani, Japanese names? Of course! But also names of discharged veterans of World War II, who have sought to continue helping the war effort by taking jobs at Tooele Ordnance Depot. In spite of their Japanese names they are Americans both by birth and by choice. They have proven their loyalty to American ideals and their preference for the American way of living and although no longer in the army they continue to fight for both at Tooele.

SCIENCE BUILDING NOW COMPLETED

The new high school science building, completed last month, is now being used by science and homemaking classes. The structure includes 8 large classrooms where subjects such as biology, physiology, chemistry, physics, agricultural science, cooking and sewing are taught.

The cooking room is equipped with electric ranges, refrigerators and a hot water heater. All classrooms are heated with an oil furnace.

The expected influx of Japanese evacuees in the Rocky Mountain States and its possible adverse effects will be the main topic for discussion when the JACL Intermountain District Council meets in Pocatello, Idaho, on January 21. The JACL expressed the opinion that sacrifices of nisei soldiers will avail little unless friendlier receptibility at home is cultivated.

Of major importance will be JACL President Saburo Kido's report of the San Francisco conference of the Committee on American Principles and Fair Play which opened January 10.

1ST LT. MIYAKE, WOUNDED WAR HERO, PROUD OF WAC SISTER

DENVER--When First Lt. Howard Y. Miyake, wounded Japanese American war veteran, arrived in Denver to visit his sister, Mrs. Duane Kimball, wife of a Seaman First Class in the United States Navy, she surprised him with the news that she had joined the WAC and would be inducted January 16.

"Fine," commented Lt. Miyake. "It's everybody's war. There's nothing at the moment I'd rather have you do than join up and shorten this thing as much as possible."

Lt. Miyake and his sister are residents of Honolulu, T.H. The lieutenant, then an enlisted man, was stationed at Schofield Barracks in Honolulu the day of the Pearl Harbor attack. Later, he and other mem-

bers of his company, all Japanese Americans, were transferred to Camp Shelby, Mississippi, for further training.

They were sent overseas in August, 1943, and took part in the invasion of Italy. Lieutenant Miyake was wounded by mortar fire June 4, 1944, within a day's march of Rome. He received a battlefield promotion from platoon sergeant to second lieutenant January 7, 1944. His commission as first lieutenant arrived a little more than a month after he was wounded. Since September, 1944, he has been a patient at the Newton D. Baker Hospital, Martinsburg, W.V.

He was awarded the Purple Heart, the Silver Star, and the Combat Infantryman's Badge.

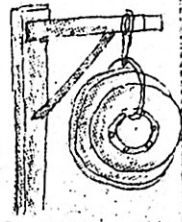
