140 RESIDENTS BEING INTERVIEWED BY AN IMMIGRATION OFFICIAL

About 140 residents are being interviewed this week by a representative of the Salt Lake City immigration office on matters pertaining to passports and their entry into the United States. Deportation proceedings have been instituted in some cases where entry was apparently illegal or where such persons were admitted temporarily and have overstayed their leave.

The immigration officer clarified that the inquiries being made by his office did not have any connection with the interviews conducted by the army team on the return of some evacuees to the West Coast.

MYER TO ATTEND SLC ALL-EVACUEE CONFERENCE

The highlight of the all-evacuee conference planned in Salt Lake City for February 16 to 21 will be the meeting of conference delegates on February 20 with National WRA Director Dillon S. Myer and other WRA officials, Mas Nara-hara, chairman of the council announced today.

MYER TO MAKE 3-DAY VISIT

National WRA Director Dillon S. Myer will make a 3-day visit to Topaz, February 21-23, to meet with the administration staff and evacuee groups.

A public meeting with Myer and the residents may also be held in the auditorium, according to L.T. Hoffman, project director.

On February 20, Director Myer is meeting with delegates to the all-evacuee conference at the New Grand Hotel in Salt Lake City.

Further details of the national director's visit will be announced later.

The agenda of the conference will be based on the effects of the recent announcements of reopening of the West Coast to evacuees and the closing of WRA camps. Problems of center operations will also be discussed.

The delegates are expected to make three concrete requests in view of the changed WRA policies and the resettlement of evacuees. They are as follows:

1. That WRA centers be kept open for the duration and/or until such time that all fields of relocation can be accepted by all evacuees.

2. To request the WRA for more resettlement assistance financially in view of the fact that to most evacuees a \$25 grant and travel expenses is insufficient for them to think constructively about resettlement. The need for federal assistance until evacuees can get fully reestablished will be emphasized.

3. To request the WRA to use its facilities to have the federal government make long term loans to evacuees who were formerly in agriculture or business to enable them to get reestablished as nearly as possible to their former statuses.

Citizens of Auburn, California, indignant over the recent violence against returning evacuees in Placer County are making plans to form the Placer County Council for Civic Unity to combat anti-Japanese movements, according to Teiko Ishida of the Nat'l JACL.

RESETTLEMENT ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE TO NEEDY

A broad program of services is available to every one on the basis of need under the resettlement assistance program administered by the Social Security board, said Hugo W. Wolter, head of the center liaison section of the relocation division, Washington, DC, in an interview.

Special arrangements are being made with state and local agencies for permanent dependency cases, he said, adding that eligible families should make plans as quickly as possible to give local and state welfare staffs time to work out details of their assistance plans.

"We believe that there is no problem that cannot now be met through the cooperation of federal and state agencies," Wolter said. "First applicants will receive first consideration from the welfare office."

CANNERY WORKERS FOR SACRAMENTO RECRUITED HERE

One hundred twenty-five men for a Sacramento, Calif., cannery are now being recruited here by Frank Hayashida of 4-7-E.

Work season starts February 25 and includes cutting, washing, packing and canning asparagus. This will be followed by planting, harvesting and canning tomatoes.

Wages are on piece work basis. According to Hayashida, even inexperienced men can earn up to \$10 per day. The work is considered essential for men over 30.

Meals are furnished for \$1.50 per day. Dormitory style housing is provided free, and rooms are also available for couples.

This company has hired Japanese workers in the past.

BLOCK CASABA LEAGUE RULES, REGULATIONS GIVEN

The rules and regulations of the block basketball league were recently announced.

The following is the list:

1. Single A games shall be played by 20 minute halves, running time. There will be five minutes of warm-up before the game and during the half.

2. Each team is allowed 3 timeouts consisting of one minute each during the game.

3. Neither team will be allowed to take a timeout

during the last three minutes of the game.

4. Double A games shall be played by 25 minute halves running time. Rules 2 and 3 also apply to the Double A games.

5. Any team using a player not listed on its roster that they handed in will automatically forfeit the game in which the player participated.

6. Each team must furnish a referee five minutes before start of the game. Any delay will automatically cut down the

playing time of the game.

7. Each team must furnish a scorekeeper and the result must be handed in to the CAS office sometime during the following day of the game.

8. If a block has two teams entered in the league, a player in the single A league could play for this double A team if the latter lacks players, but no vice-versa.

9. No additional player on the roster is allowed unless approved by the managers and the commissioner.

DELTA BUS NEW RATES GIVEN BLOCK SHOPPERS

Special transportation concession to reduce bus fare to Delta has been approved on a 30-day trial basis by Delta merchants. Under this new arrangement, which was negotiated by the local block managers, all persons going to Delta for block shopping purposes will be given the special rate. The new rate will go into effect beginning tomorrow morning.

Between 30 to 35 block shoppers will be accommodated each morning for this purpose. Residents desiring to go block shopping should make a request in advance with their respective block managers.

Residents of block 1 through 22 are scheduled for block shopping on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, while persons from block 23 through 42 will go on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.

Persons going to Delta for purposes other than for block shopping will still be required to pay the full rate, it was stated.

ISSUE PERMITS TO JAPANESE ALIENS

All US district attorneys were advised by Attorney General Francis Biddle to issue travel permits to the West Coast to Japanese aliens on the same basis as other enemy aliens. Japanese aliens will however, be required to state in his application that he has not been issued an individual exclusion order from the evacuated zones.

The US attorneys will notify the Alien Enemy Control Unit of the Justice Department of all such Japanese aliens to whom such travel permits have been granted so that the names may be checked against the individual exclusion list. Travel permits will be issued on the statement of the Japanese alien that he has not been notified of individual exclusion and will not be withheld from the applicant until the US attorney makes notifications to the Justice Department.
