## FARMERS LEASE 22 UNITS OF PROJECT LAND

Twenty-two of the twenty-four farm units of the project land which were offered for lease to farmers, have now been leased, according to Wendell Palmer, head of the agriculture section.

Eleven farmers in the areas around Delta, Hinckley and Deseret have leased all 'the land to date. The 2 remnining nits consist of 1600 acres and is mainly pasture land.

Both the bride and groom formerly lived in Alameda, California.


