CALIF AGENCIES "DIXIE" TO BE SHOWN HERE GIVE COOPERATION DURING NEW ORLEANS WEEK ON WELFARE CASES

California state and county welfare officials are co-operating 100 per cent with the WRA in working out plans of dependent returnees, stated Claud Pratt, local welfare counsellor who returned here this week from the coast. Pratt visited the Los Angeles and San Francisco WRA offices and the state and county welfare agencies to discuss problems relative to the return of dependent persons.

Persons requiring public assistance have already returned to their homes in California and seem to be making happy and satisfactory adjustments, he said. Many other plans have been completed and county and state welfare offices are waiting the return of the individuals whose plans have been worked out.

INDIVIDUAL PLANS

Assistance plans have also been worked out providing some individuals for county homes or old age homes, while with others, giving public assistance in their own homes.

ARMY NURSE CORPS GETS TWO MORE NISEI WOMEN

WASHINGTON, DC--With the acceptance of two more nisei girls, disclosed to the WRA by the War Department, there are now five Japanese Americans commissioned in the Army Nurse corps.

The fifth, Masako Mary Yamada, whose mother and sister relocated from Heart Mountain to join her in New York was inducted March 30.

Teiko Harata went on active duty April 2 at Tilton General Hospital near Fort Dix, N.J.

Miss Yamada's mother, Mrs. Kama Yamada, her sister, Mrs. Fred Miyasato, the former Helen Sakiye Yamada, and a brother, Joe, who is resettled in Chicago, lived before evacuation at 613 East 6th street, Los Angeles, Cal.

Until her acceptance in the ANC, Miss Yamada taught in a large New York public high school, was ward instructor, assistant supervisor in surgery and first supervisor in a special service.

Properly qualified nisei women who have been cleared for military service by the War department are accepted into the Army Nurse corps for assignment in the United States on the same basis as other applicants who meet ANC requirements.

Any registered nurse wishing to volunteer may apply at the nearest Red Cross Recruiting station.

TOOLE WANTS MANY TYPISTS AND CLERKS

The Toole Engineer Redistribution center in Toole, Utah, wants 20 clerks and 30 typists with CAF-2 ratings. Wages are \$1750 a year including overtime.

Three clerk-stenographers with CAF-3 ratings are also needed. The job pays \$166 a month. The work is similar to the office work at the warehouse here in the center, it was stated by James Jennings of the Salt Lake relocation office.

CLEVELAND ISSUES NEW JOB BULLETIN

CLEVELAND--A special job bulletin containing offers for domestics, cooks, gardeners and caretakers in the Great Lakes area has just been received by the relocation office.

In a foreword letter to the bulletin, Robert M. Cullum, Great Lakes area supervisor, stresses the advantages of these jobs:

"These selected jobs--many of them for issei with children--are typical of a great number of such offers in the district files. All these situations include maintenance thus eliminating the housing problems. Not only does such employment afford immediate security in terms of board and housing, but it also enables the newcomer to get a breathing spell when he may look around and decide what he might better do in the new community on a permanent basis."

TRAVELERS AID SOCIETY GIVES SERVICE TO PARALYZED RETURNEE

Typical of the type of service offered to all travelers by the Travelers Aid society is that recently received by Rikisaburo Ohashi, a paralyzed returnee.

Ohashi was met in Sacramento by a representative of the society and given every possible attention there while he and his family changed trains for Modesto.

The representative of the Travelers Aid society wired the Stanislaus County Welfare department at Modesto to meet the train with a wheel chair, as was done in Sacramento.

This group of patients received approximately 9,500 prescriptions, X-rays, laboratory examinations, diathermy treatments, and basal metabolism tests bring the total to 22,126.

During that period, 299 major and minor operations were performed at the hospital. Only 3 or one per cent of the surgery was performed off the project.

Other types of care are provided by the hospital through its dental, laboratory and dietary departments.

With arrangements made with a hospital in Salt Lake City, 80 patients were referred to outside treatment or care. These included 14 who were treated by the Crippled Children's service and others for X-ray diagnosis and bronchoscopic examinations.

The local hospital also maintains the cooperation of other agencies which check X-ray readings for tuberculosis and heart conditions and pathology, allergy and other laboratory tests.
