IOO DEALERS BUY UP SURPLUS FARM EQUIPMENT HERE

Over 100 certified dealers from Colorado, Idaho, and other parts of the country paid \$11,521 for the surplus farm equipment at the sale held here Saturday, according to Melvin Robins, property control officer.

The sale of the 100 or more items of surplus quipment, which started late Saturday morning, was completed approximately 2. hours later. Each item was sold on the average of bout one a minute.

EDUCATION UNIT PLANS DRAFT CARDS MUST CLOSING SCHOOLS JUNE 1

The education section has developed plans to close the elementary and the high school on June 1, announced Dr. LeGrande Noble, superintendent of education.

Approximately 1336 students now enrolled in the primary and secondary will gradually relocate to outside high schools and colleges. Already 25 students have transferred to outside schools since January 1. No summer school is contemplated.

Since Topaz high school education is under the board of Utah which is a member of the Northwest secondary and higher institute association, there will be no doubt that the student's credits will be accepted by all high schools and colleges in United States as it has been done during the past.

Hillman Davis, chairman of the Millard County draft board, is quoted as stating it is the duty of draft boards to issue new cards each six months and that the date, on a selective service registrant's classification card should not cause him any concern as long as he is not attempting to evade his local board.

If a registrant carrying an outdated card is detained the worst that can happen to him would be detention until his local board is contacted by telegram to determine status.
