

THREE AUBURN MEN FREED OF ARSON CHARGES

SAN FRANCISCO, April 25—Two soldier brothers, Alvin and Elmer Johnson, and James E. Watson, 38, bartender, were freed of charges of arson by a jury in Auburn, Placer County, California, after six days of trial, in connection with attempted firing and dynamiting of a fruit shed on the ranch of Sumio Doi. Army authorities took the soldiers into custody for court martial on charges of absence without leave, while District Attorney Tindall, who prosecuted the case, stated he would probably press charges of contributing to delinquency of minors against James Watson. Watson's brother, Claude P. Watson, is scheduled to appear for separate trial in connection with the attempted dynamiting of the Doi property.

San Francisco newspapers reporting the story pointed out that the Johnson-Watson defense counsel said, "This is a white man's country," and stated that the Johnsons' army training was responsible for their display of hatred, made much of the Bataan march of death and atrocities committed by Japanese enemy.

WRA MAKES NO CONCESSIONS ON IMPORTANT RECOMMENDATIONS

No concessions were made by WRA on the important recommendations made by the delegates to the all- evacuee conference held in Salt Lake City two months ago, according to comments on the proposals received here recently from Dillon S. Myer, national WRA director. However, Myer congratulated the petitioners for their accomplishments as highly significant action representing 60,000 residents of relocation centers.

DH 7, 8, 41 TO SUSPEND OPERATIONS ON MAY 6

A systematic plan for closing block dining halls on a population and geographic basis was announced today by Project Director L. T. Hoffman. Block managers, councilman and chefs concerned were informed of the plan today.

Dining halls in blocks 7, 8 and 41 will be the first to close under this plan. They will close after the evening meal on Sunday, May 6. Residents of these blocks thereafter will be served meals as follows: block 7; barracks 7-12, dining hall 14; block 8, dining hall 1; block 41, dining hall 34.

ARMY CALLS SET FOR MAY 1, 2, 3

Notices for four men to report for induction on May 3 and four others for physicals on May 2 have been received here. Two names have been added to the active duty list for May 1. They are Hisashi Tani, 11-10-B; and Yuzo Sakai, 38-10-E.

Those called for induction are Jitsuo Yamamura; 39-5-D; Charles C. Nakao, 30-2-C; Ben Takahashi, 12-5-F; and George K. Nakano, 5-4-A.

The physical list includes Thomas T. Okuma, 29-5-A; Toraiichi Matsuzaki, 30-8-B; Harry H. Yuki, 5-9-B; and Isao Baba, 9-3-AB.

The relocation of each 200 residents from the center will be justification for closing a dining hall.

Last dining halls to close will be 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 29; 30, 31, 33, 34, and 35 as they are so located that they will be within one block of any closed dining hall. The dining halls in blocks 1 and 2 also will remain open as long as possible, the first because of its location and the second because it is a diet kitchen.

Ten days' notice of closing of a dining hall will be given the community council, block managers and others concerned.

Personnel of dining halls will be transferred to other dining halls or referred to the placement office for assignment to other work.

R. IKEDA MEMORIAL SERVICE SET MONDAY

Memorial service for the late Pfc. Roy Ikeda who was killed in action earlier this month in Italy will be held at the local Buddhist church Monday evening at 7 o'clock.

The late soldier is survived by his mother, Mrs. Takoko Ikeda, and six sisters and brothers.

ACLU SEEKS TEST CASES OF CERTAIN LOYAL EXCLUDEES FROM WEST COAST

Dear Editor;

It has become painfully evident that the military authorities on the west coast have issued individual exclusion orders against a great many American citizens of Japanese ancestry who are by no reasonable test disloyal. Many who were cleared by the War Relocation authority after F.B.I. investigations are now excluded by the army. This conflict between concepts of disloyalty, serious enough to justify exclusion from military zones or detention, plainly demands review by the courts.

The American Civil Liberties union, as an organization interested in the protection of civil rights, is prepared upon request of those persons interested to aid any citizens of Japanese ancestry ordered excluded who have not applied for expatriation or repatriation to Japan and who did not give a negative answer to questions 27 and 28 in the questionnaire filled out by all evacuees. We would also consider as suitable court cases persons who did not answer these questions at all, or who later changed their answers from negative to affirmative. In addition, we understand there are some persons residing in other parts of the United States who have been ordered excluded from the west coast though they never resided there. Such persons would appear suitable also for court tests where no application for expatriation or repatriation has been made and where no clear evidence of disloyalty is found.

Several cases are already pending challenging individual exclusion orders in the federal court in Southern California. These may give us a ruling in the higher courts which will lay down principles for the military authorities. But these few cases are not enough to establish a rule applicable to a wide variety of persons.

CONIAB MAY INFLUENCE CALIF. ON EVACUEE ISSUE

The United Nations Peace Security conference being held in San Francisco may possibly induce Californians of that region to beat down agitation against returning evacuees, Carey McWilliams, noted author and authority on minority problems, predicted in an article appearing in the April 23 issue of the New York PM.

McWilliams noted that leaders like Dr. Paul S. Taylor of the University of California, Attorney General Robert W. Kenny, and Frank A. Clarvoe, editor of the San Francisco News, "have been reminding Californians--with telling effect--that the eyes of the world will be riveted on the west coast during the conference."

On a recent west coast trip, McWilliams says he found general improvement in attitudes, along with some attempts to renew organized anti-evacuee activities.

He also points out the lack of incidents in the state of Washington as contrasted with anti-evacuee activities in Oregon.

PIREST AIDS NISEI SOLDIERS IN ITALY

(With the 5th Army in Italy)—The combination of Japanese Americans of the US 442nd Infantry Regiment and Italian partisans, led by a fighting priest called Pietro, proved the winning formula in the capture of the coastal towns of Massa and Carrara and a lot of German prisoners.

The German prisoners reported that "Turks" had been added to this front of many nationalities, while Pietro's partisans call the nisei the "Mongoli". "The Germans think they are terrible; the partisans think they are wonderful."

プラテリウアーウアレーへの日系米人の移住を妨げんとし、九十のビーター大町夫妻と一名署名の要請書の六子、ハイ、是松夫妻と原田は明にネブラスカシエルトンの小教市民の激量な嫉視及経済的對抗によるものとして、W.R.A.地方監督並に轉任代理監督ブルデンスロース嬢は語つた。直ちに調査に着手し、オマハのU.S.地方検事は、排日組六名が豊饒なウアレーに日系人の大學移住計画があるかの如く云ひ觸らし、隣人に恐怖の念を焚きつけんと試みた。要請書に署名せし者で後悔せしるべきU.S.法規の條

項を示した。四月六日W.R.A.によつてシエルトンに開かれたる集會に二百名以上の人が集つた。その多数は日系人に好意を示した。右三家族の代表であつた引退農夫天Hリッピンコト氏は、人種迫害及斯る不寛容を絶滅せんがために、自分の息子は海外で戦つてゐると述べた。排日事件の記事が新聞に現はれるや、系米人を保護する委員會が設けられ、三家族は諸方から座入を申込まれた。大町家族はもじシエルトンに留まり、是松家族はせり離れた。オマハに就働して、轉向し、親日農家に雇はれることとなつた。
