VETERAN SOLDIERS TO BE RELEASED FROM ARMY

Many of the approximately 450, nisei soldiers with kin in Topaz may be released from the United States army this year, a war department announcement indicates.

The announcement, made in Washington Saturday, said that about 1,300,000 veterans of long fighting in Europe and the Pacific will be released and that, combined with other discharges for physical and similar reasons, about 2,000,000 men now in service will be out a year from now.

About two-thirds of the combat units in Europe will come back through the United States during the redeployment process and the troops will be given furloughs of varying length, but probably not exceeding 30 days. Men who have been longest overseas and fought hardest, and those who have chattered, will get first consideration in demobilization.

V-E DAY IS ANNOUNCED THIS MORNING

This is V-E day!

The unconditional surrender of Germany to the Western Allies and Russia, ending the war in Europe, was announced officially at 7 AM today by President Truman and Prime Minister Churchill.

This announcement was preceded by two unofficial reports of the Nazis' surrender. Early yesterday the German radio at Flensburg told the German people that unconditional terms had been signed during the night and urged them to cease resistance and cooperate with the victors.

Soon afterwards, at 7:45 AM, Topazans listening to their radios heard an Associated Press flash that the surrender had been signed, Sunday, (6:45 PM, Mountain Time) in a little red schoolhouse in Rheims, France, General Eisenhower's headquarters. Colonel Jodel and Freidburg reportedly signed for the German government.

U.S. TO CELEBRATE MAY FESTIVAL FRI.

CIVILIAN LABOR SHORTAGE TO BE DISSOLVED BY DISCHARGED GI'S

WASHINGTON, DC--Manpower may get tighter before officials predicted Saturday that the planned discharge of 2,000,000 soldiers will dissolve the civilian labor shortage within a few months after V-E day.

They pointed out, however, that the current manpower needs of critical war industries are greater than they were a few weeks ago, and that the pinch

They estimated that within six months after V-E day there will be only about a dozen tight labor areas in the country. This will bring a drastic modification of prevailing regulations which prohibit industrially deferred men from changing jobs without permission of their draft boards.

CLEANEST BLOCK IN TOPAZ TO BE DETERMINED SAT.

Topaz's cleanest block will be determined Saturday afternoon when judges inspect the results of Clean-up day. The inspection will be based on the appearance of grounds and dining halls. Coal must be in neat piles. Coal must be in neat piles. Fuel boxes in kitchens also must be orderly. Motor transport crews will pick up rubbish Saturday afternoon, Monday and Tuesday.

Office buildings will be cleaned Saturday. The general clean-up will be made in the afternoon. Beverage bars for workers will be set up in dining halls by mess management.

Old clothes should be washed and mended for collection by Boy Scouts Monday and Tuesday. The donated garments will be shipped to the war devastated countries of Europe and Asia on the basis of their greatest need and shipping space. Items most urgently needed are baby clothes, mens' and boys' clothing, caps and knitted headwear, bedding and shoes. The shoes should be tied together in pairs. Usable piece goods also can be used by the United Nations Clothing committee.

Clean-up posters will be made by pupils in the first six grades of the elementary school. They will be judged by a board under Fire Chief C. H. Roraback and the best ones posted in dining halls. An essay writing contest on Clean-up day will be held among high school English classes. The outstanding essay will be published in the Rambler.

END OF WAR IN EUROPE CELEBRATED

The announcement that the war in Europe had ended was celebrated at a high school assembly held in the auditorium Monday morning.

The student body also paid tribute to the Nazi soldiers of Topaz who had died in action.

ABE ADMITTED TO USW HOSP. IN SALT LAKE

Saburo Abe, 56, Japan-born veteran of the first World War, was admitted to the United States Veterans' hospital in Salt Lake City today although his disability was not caused by his army service, Mary Lue Cochran, medical social worker, said.

Abe came to San Francisco by way of Hawaii, at 18. He served in the First Hawaiian Infantry in 1918-19 but was not injured. He received his American citizenship at San Francisco in 1937, and is a member of the Townsend-Harris post of the American Legion.

SIX TOPAZ PATIENTS LEAVE TODAY FOR SAN FRANCISCO HOSPITAL

Six Topaz hospital patients left today for the San Francisco hospital, Mary Lue Cochran, medical social worker, said today. They are George E. Matsusaki, Manki Nagata, Kakuji Tamura, Kiyokichi Yamaguchi, Tokuyo Sudo and Yasuhiro Inouye. They will be taken to Salt Lake City by ambulance and car. There drawing rooms and pullman compartments on the west-

bound train will be waiting for them so that they may be put to bed immediately. A male nurse from the San Francisco WRA will meet the ambulance in Salt Lake City and give the patients nursing care.

"The best wishes of all their friends here go with them," Mrs. Cochran said, "and they, in turn, urge their friends to hurry home so they can look forward to visits from them."

FISTERE REPORTS IMPROVEMENT IN PORTLAND MARKETS

Harold S. Fistere, area supervisor of the Washington-Oregon WRA territory, stated today that the market situation in Portland is continuing to improve "slowly but surely".

"The latest reports we have are from B. Fujii of Troutdale, Oregon, who tells our Portland staff that he sold his supply of dry onions in the Portland market a week ago. He also said that the market master told him to tell other Japanese growers to bring their produce in and they would have no difficulty marketing it," said Fistere.

Walter Mewing, marketing specialist from the Washington, DC, WRA office is on special detail in Portland to work out the marketing problems of the area, and he indicates that favorable progress is being made daily, Fistere concluded.

UNCERTAINTY OF TRAVEL TO BE ELIMINATED BY SPECIAL TRAINS

The special reserved cars going to Chicago on May 14 and 28 have already booked a number of passengers to many eastern cities including Minneapolis, New York, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Boston, Ann Arbor, Kenosha, Sidney, Detroit and Chicago, the leave office stated.

The cars going to San Francisco on May 21 and June 4 will leave for Sacramento, Richmond, Berkeley, and San Mateo as well as San Francisco.

The use of these special cars will eliminate the uncertainty of travel as experienced recently due to the crowded trains which could not accept any more passengers. Furthermore, seats are assured on these special cars, which would be of great convenience to families with children, the leave office stated.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR NISEI GIRL MADE BY SCHOOL

A \$100 scholarship for a nisei girl has been established at James Milliken university, Decatur, Ill., according to William Kir-Stimon, acting relocation officer of the Greater Illinois district.

The scholarship fund was raised by students of the university as a result of their interest in the relocation program. The college is anxious to enroll a personable young girl who will be an able representative for the nisei.

Milliken university is a four-year liberal arts college and also has a college of music. The enrollment is at present about 300 students, although the normal enrollment in peacetime is in excess of 600. A room has been reserved already for the prospective scholarship student for the 1945 fall term. In addition to this \$100 scholarship, it may be possible for the girl to obtain a yearly loan of \$150 from the college without interest, 15 per cent of the debt to be cancelled if she graduates from the university. She may also secure a part-time job, working ten hours weekly and earning a total of \$130 for the year, or working for her full board and earning about \$25 per month.
