NNOUNCED

This is V-E day!

The unconditional surrender of Germany to the Western Allies and Russia, ending the war in Europe, was announced officially at 7 AM today by President Trumon and Prime Minister Churchill.

This announcement was preceded by two unofficial reports of the Nazis' surrender. Early yesterday the German radio at Flemsburg told the German people that unconditional terms had been signed during the night and urged them to cease resistance and cooperate with the victors.

Soon afterwards, at 7:45 AM, Topozons listening to their radios heard an Associated Press flash that the surrender had been signed, Sunday, (6:45 PM, Mountain Time) in a little red schoolhouse Rheims, France, General Elsenhower's headquarters. Colonels Todel and Freidnburg reportedly signed for the German government.
