CONSTITUTION RATIFICATION

REACHES 2591

With only Block 22 unaccounted for at this writing, the Constitution of Topaz had been ratified by an overwhelming vote of 2591 out of 3434 votes cast Tues of Miss Mmily Minton and day. The "no" vote amounted to 830. Twenty-eight blocks voted "yes" and 4 blocks "no"

About 75% of the residents voted. The average vote was 112 to a block. Highest vote was in Block 33 with 166, Block 31 was next with 157 and Block 19 was third with 153. Lowest vote was in Block 28 with 38. Closest vote was in Block 33 where "no" won out by 84 to 81.

There were 13 "void" votes, and out of 36 absentee Protestant Church, Rec 22, ballots cast there were 34 "yes".
