A SUCCESS

As the culmination of a series of experiments conducted by Hi Korematsu, head of the Agricultural Research Department, 125 pounds of the finest quality bean sprouts were grown in Laun-

dry 28 under the care of Mr. and Mrs. S. Toguchi. In order to insure a sufficient supply for each dining hall, facilities are being set up for the production of 1800 pounds per week. Rated high among the vegetables in vitamin C content, bean sprouts have an added advantage in that they mature in only 7 days. Residents who are interested in this field are asked to contact Hi Korematsu at the Agricultural Division.
