

GOV. MAW INDUCTS COUNCILMEN

TOPAZANS HOLD BANQUET IN HONOR OF EXECUTIVE

As the first State governor to visit any WRA center, Herbert B. Maw is scheduled to arrive at the Central Utah War Relocation Project late this afternoon. The concurrent events which will open the "Governor's Day" program prepared under the chairmanship of James F. Hughes, assistant project director, are the public flag ceremony to be held at the administration area and the reception tea honoring the visit of Mrs. Herbert B. Maw at Rec 10 from 5 PM today. To the latter event, all women residents are invited.

At a colorful ceremony in which the new flag pole located near the administration buildings will be formally dedicated by Utah's chief executive, the public will have its opportunity to see and hear Governor Maw.

The Governor and his party will be the guests of honor at a banquet in Dining Hall 11 from 6:30 PM. On that occasion the 33 members of the new Community Council will be sworn into office by the Governor.

Because of the pressure of his official duties, the visiting executive, Mrs. Maw, and his aides are planning to return to Salt Lake City a little after 9 PM tonight.

Tsune Baba, chairman of the new Council, released the following written statement welcoming Governor Maw:

"In behalf of the residents of Topaz, I take pleasure in welcoming the Honorable Herbert B. Maw, Governor of the State, and Mrs. Maw, the First Lady of Utah, to the State's newest city.

"We are indeed grateful to you for your active interest in us, and I hope we shall continue to receive your understanding consideration.

"May your brief visit here be a pleasant and memorable one."

BANE, CORNWALL ASSOCIATES OF STATE CHIEF

The figure of center interest this week is Governor Herbert B. Maw, whose arrival today will mark him as one of the most distinguished personalities to visit Topaz.

Local employment chief Claude C. Cornwall and Dr. Laverne Bane, director of the City's Adult Education department, are former associates of the Governor.

Governor Maw and Cornwall served together on the faculty of the L.D.S. University until the first World War, when the chief executive left for France as a chaplain of his regiment.

Dr. Bane's association with Governor Maw began at the state university when both were members of the speech department. The latter was debate coach from 1927 to 1929, after which he was elevated to the rank of dean of men.

When Governor Herbert B. Maw visits Topaz this afternoon, he will be coming as the highest State executive elected by the Utah citizenry, to induct into office the members of the Community Council, the members of which were elected by the residents of Topaz.

In another sense, Governor Maw as the elected head of the State government of Utah will be paying his respects to Topaz, which is a project of the Federal government. The Governor's induction of our Council will be his way of showing his respects to the City of Topaz and at the same time to the Federal government.

But there is one other element contained in this visit, and that is Governor Maw's personal human interest in the 8,000 newly arrived residents in the State whose leadership lies in his hands.

It was on September 2 that the Project Director paid a courtesy call on the Governor in his office in Salt Lake City. The Governor was naturally interested to learn the plans for the creation of Topaz. He wished us good luck, and in response to the Project Director's invitation to come down and visit Topaz, the Governor said that he would be very pleased to do that.

So this visit on Thursday will be the fulfillment of that expressed desire.

It is hoped that as many of the residents of Topaz as possible will gather for the simple but significant flag services by the administration building at 5 o'clock, at which time Topaz will welcome Governor Maw.

COUNCIL FORMS MERIT BOARD, LAW COMMISSION

In accordance with the Constitution of Topaz, a judicial commission and a merit rating board were established by the Community Council at the City Hall last Monday afternoon.

Selected to act on the commission were James Hirano, D.T. Uchida, Kaytaro Tsukamoto, Tamon Katase, Hideo Iyeki, Morisaburo Nakashima and Sadao Hamada. They will serve for the next 6 months, during which they are to conduct hearings on all cases involving violations of ordinances enacted by the Council.

Edwin Kitow, Sus Yamashita, Akiyoshi Moriwaki, T.R. Matsuoka, Toshimi Ogawa, Mrs. S. Fujita and Ichiro Shibata have been appointed to serve on the merit rating board. One of the chief functions of the board is to recommend qualified residents for employment outside the Project.

It was agreed that Councilmen Tsune Baba, James Nishimura and Masato Maruyama were selected to represent the residents at the weekly administrative cabinet meetings.

A committee was formed to frame the manual of the labor arbitration board and to recommend residents to serve as board members.

USE PHONES ONLY FOR EMERGENCIES

The use of the recently installed outdoor telephones was explained recently by Project Director Charles F. Ernst. It was emphasized that only on emergency occasions when immediate contact with public services are necessary may the residents use these phones, which have been placed in red metal boxes located on poles distinguished by black and white markings. Calls may be placed only to the hospital, the fire department, the Internal Security division and the Project Director or Assistant Director.

Ernst added that the phones should be used only when no other means of communication available will suffice the emergency.

WRA MAY SHIP EVACUEE GOODS FROM FRESNO

All residents who have property stored in the WRA warehouse in Fresno, Calif., who desire any or all of their property forwarded to Topaz, are asked to contact the office of the Project Attorney at Rec 4 immediately.

For economical reasons, the WRA considers it desirable to ship stored property in as large quantities as possible. The Transportation Division of the San Francisco WRA office requests immediate attention by residents concerned.

FIELD WORKERS TO SERVE FOR PUBLIC WELFARE

The Community Welfare section announces the initiation of social welfare field work. Home calls by qualified social workers are now being made in accordance with a plan calling for the assignment of at least one worker for each occupied block.

Residents are invited to consult their Community Welfare section representative on any matter ranging from minor information to major discussions. A list of services available has been given to each family. Opinions and suggestions for community improvements are expected to be directed to the representatives for consideration.

PUBLIC FLAG CEREMONY SET FOR TODAY

To honor the visit of Utah's chief executive, a brief flag ceremony befitting the significance of the occasion will be held in front of the administration buildings today from 5 PM.

The general public is welcomed to participate in the ceremony.

Resident American Legionnaires will form a guard of honor.

The program includes: 1. Escort of Governor Maw to platform by Boy Scout troops; 2. "Utah, We Love Thee," by chorus; 3. Salutation by Dr. Carl Hirota; 4. Dedication of the flag pole by the Governor; 5. Protestant invocation; 6. "To the Colors" by the Boy Scouts; 7. "The Star Spangled Banner" by chorus; 8. Pledge of Allegiance; 9. Address by the Governor; 10. Response by James Hirano, representing the residents.

The 45-foot flag pole, recently obtained from a CCC camp at Castledale, Utah, was erected yesterday morning at a location chosen by Roscoe E. Bell, chief of the Agricultural division.
