GOVERNOR MAW INDUCTS NEW COUNCILMEN

At a ceremony witnessed by over 250 residents and members of the local WRA administration, Hon. Herbert B. Maw, Governor of the State of Utah, administered the oath, officially inducting the 33 members of Topaz's first permanent Community Council into office, the tenure of which is 6 months.

The banquet which accompanied the inaugural ceremony was opened with the singing of the National Anthem by Councilwoman Mitzi Shiraishi and an invocation by Rev. K. M. Kumata.

Entertainment included a violin selection by Miss Ernestina Teranishi, vocals by Miss Mitzi Shiraishi, a piano solo by Miss Emiko Somiya and a harmonica concert by Toshio Suzuki.

Professor Chiura Obata, after an address delivered in behalf of the residents, presented his water-color painting "Evening Glow," depicting a local sunset scene, to the Governor. A second painting was given to Dr. Carl Hirota, chairman of the 1942 temporary Council, as a gesture of appreciation for the services of the former Council.

Chairman Toshimi Ogawa introduced the Governor and Mrs. H. B. Maw, and his party, which included Mr. and Mrs. Tracy R. Welling. Welling is the head of the State Department of Agriculture.

In an address preceding the induction process, Project Director Charles F. Ernst outlined the role of the Council and its significance to American democracy. He then called upon the Governor to swear the new councilmen into office.

Those attending the banquet were individually received by Governor and Mrs. Maw at the close of the affair.

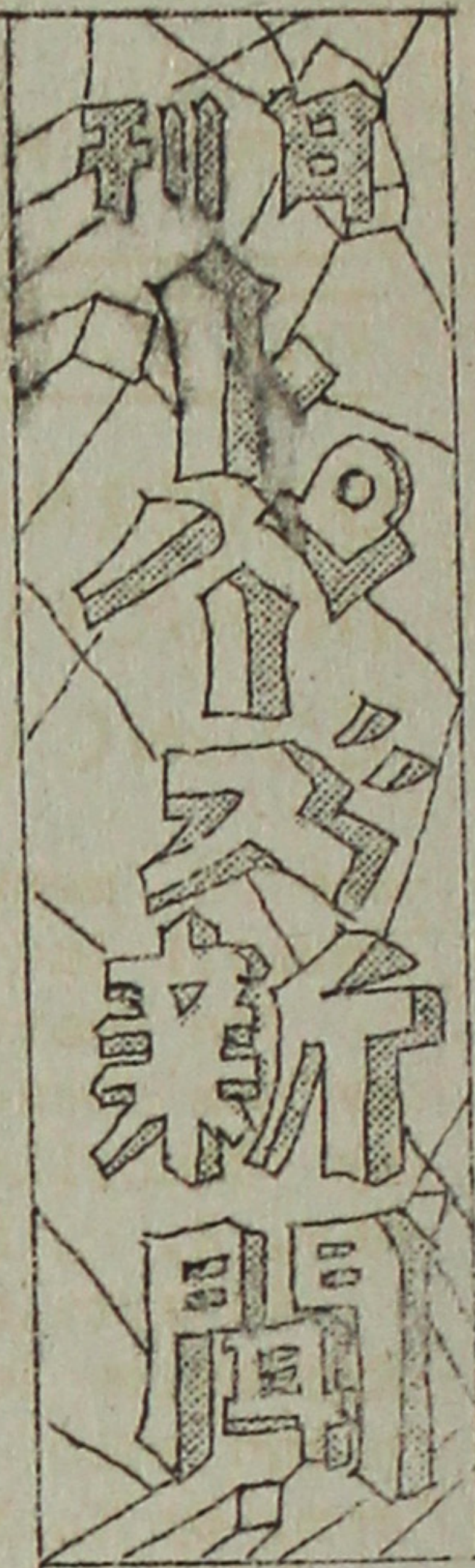
CASABA: Six basketball games in the junior and senior high school leagues are scheduled to be played tomorrow afternoon.
