CITY COUNCIL TO SELECT

3 EXECUTIVES

Nominations for executive posts in the city Government were held by the City Council last Thursday afternoon. The offices involved are city manager, city clerk and city treasurer.

Those nominated were: D.T. Uchida, Toshimi Ogawa, Edwin Kitow and Kunisaku Iino for city manager; Bob Iki, Paul Ida, James Hirano and Ichiro Akiya for city clerk; and Sangor Ito, Paul Ida, Aki Moriwaki and Roy Takagi for city treasurer. Next week, the Council will select one person from each of these rosters to fill the 3 offices.

Nominations were also made for members of the Board of Arbitration. A recommendation was made by Shozo Tsuchida, resident attorney, that qualifications for membership on the board include knowledge of business procedure and practice as well as actual business experience, and that one member have some knowledge of law.

57 YOUNG NISEI REGISTER AT DRAFT BOARD NO. 30

Fifty seven nisei of 18 and 19 in the City registered for Selective Service last weekend, it was announced today by Tsune Baba, chairman of the committee in charge of registration. Seven issei, who had not previously registered in the 42-65 bracket, registered at the same time.

MEETING HELD TO ORGANIZE JACL CHAPTER

The initial step for the organization of a Topaz chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League was taken last night at an informal meeting of interested residents and former JACL leaders at 32-12-C. After a discussion on the necessity and feasibility of founding such an organization, it was unanimously agreed that a League chapter should be established.

The consensus of opinion among those attending the meeting was centered about the need for an organized front among the Japanese Americans against the various anti-minority groups throughout the nation. Cognizant of this need, they decided that the JACL, in being the only nation-wide nisei organization in existence today, should be the central organization for the representation of the Japanese people in America.

A decision was made that the contemplated Topaz chapter should be independent of the former bay region chapters both in leadership and policy.

An organizational rally to be held on Feb. 7 is now being planned.

A permanent draft board --Local 30-- has been set up at 1-9-E to meet the Selective Service regulation requiring that "during the continuance of the present war, those who were born on or after January 1, 1925, shall be registered on the day they attain the 18th anniversary of the day of their birth."

Exceptions for registrations are made for persons whose birthdays fall on Sundays or holidays, in which case the registrations may be filed on the day following.

CO-OP BEAUTY SHOP NOW OPEN FOR BUSINESS

The City's first beauty shop was opened for business last Thursday after weeks of anticipation by the womanhood of Topaz. The salon, operated at present by beauticians Mrs. Ito Okamoto and Alice Suyehiro under the Consumer Co-operative Enterprises, is located at the southern part of the old post office building.

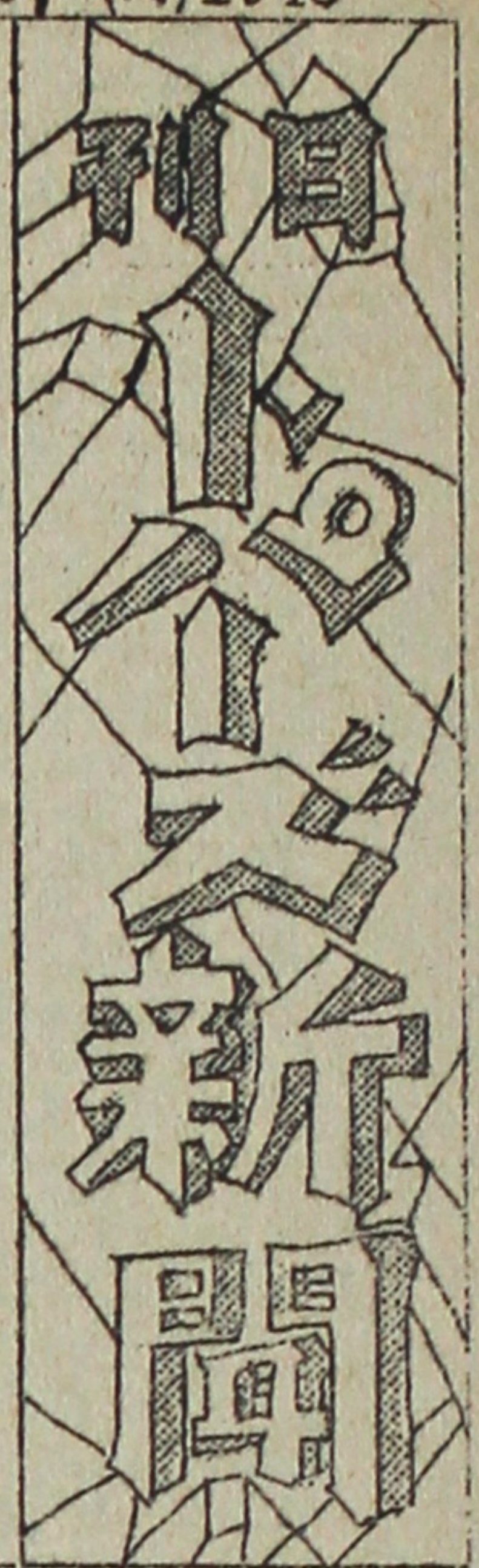
Present service includes only machine permanents and finger waves. Machineless permanents will be offered as soon as the necessary supplies arrive, the Co-op office stated.
