



TOPAZ PORK

Pork sausage from hogs which were raised on the Project farm and slaughtered last week will be served for breakfast at the dining halls tomorrow, it was announced today by Francis Watson, head of the commissary section.

Three thousand pounds of meat were obtained from the 11 slaughtered hogs.

"The quality of pork from Topaz hogs is very high," commented Watson.

CO-OP STORE HOLDS SALE OF DRY GOODS

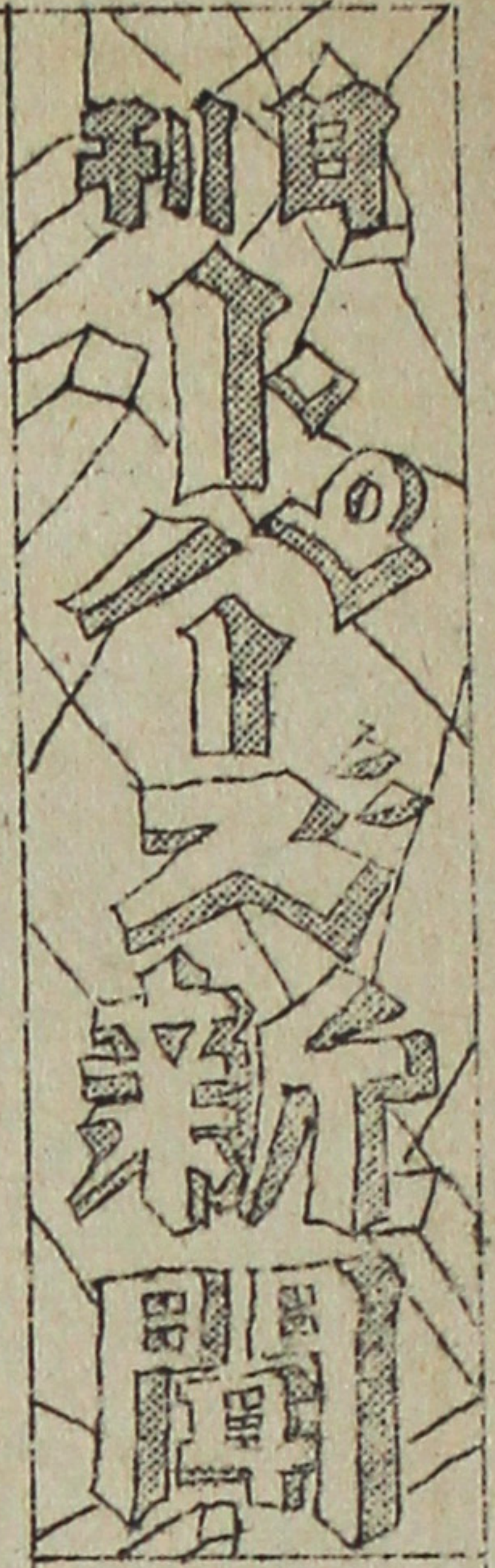
The odds and ends sale sponsored by the dry goods department of the Co-op will continue throughout this week for the benefit of those who were unable to attend last week because of the dust storm.
