

NEW HOSPITAL HEAD ARRIVES FROM JEROME

Dr. Donnell W. Boardman, former acting medical officer of the Jerome Relocation Center, Ark., arrived in the City a few days ago to take over duties at the Topaz Hospital.

Replacing Dr. W.S. Ramsey, Dr. Boardman's appointment as acting chief medical officer will be effective Feb. 1.

Formerly of New York City, Dr. Boardman received his training at the Columbia School for Physicians and Surgeons, and then was connected in turn with the Roosevelt, Bellevue and Presbyterian Hospitals in New York. Following a 2-week stay at the Rohwer Relocation Center, Ark., he transferred to Jerome on Oct. 2, and remained there until his appointment here.

MEN NEEDED FOR FARM, PUBLIC WORKS DIVISIONS

A fine chance to obtain vocational training in such work as carpentry, plumbing, farming, hog-raising, cattle-raising and truck gardening is offered to as many as wish to apply.

These men are badly needed by the Agriculture and

Public Works divisions to work in the construction of irrigation and drainage systems and in the building of schools, farm buildings and additional dwellings, it was announced today by J.F. Hughes, assistant project director.

Applications should be made at the Placement office in Rec 4.

Hughes also stated that any who transfer from present occupations to accept positions in these departments will definitely be assigned to the work for which they apply.

He especially made this appeal to men who are working in positions which may be filled by women, including those in kitchens, at the hospital and in the Administration building who may desire to get employment at outside work.

It was pointed out that men who are now holding jobs which women might wish to fill are forcing these women to accept unemployment compensation, which is only a fraction of what they could earn in regular work.

In the future, when the city board of supervisors has been established, the sponsorship of the forums will pass from the Community Activities section into the hands of the supervisors.

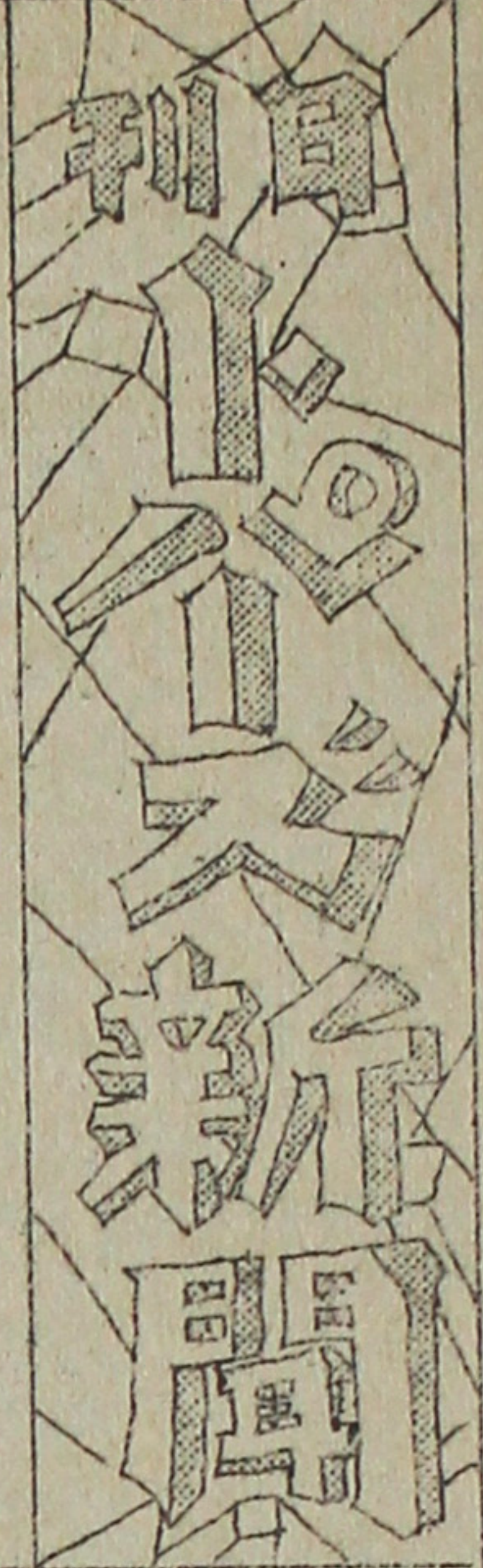
On Saturday night, Jan. 30, the forum will be held in Japanese for the issei.
