

# NIGHT SCHOOL REGISTRATION

The Night School director announced today that classes in Japanese language will be offered for those people who have interest in vocations in which they will need knowledge of the language. Enrollment for the class will be taken Monday at 31-2-D, from 2 to 4 p.m. and 6:45 to 8:30 p.m.

"This new policy with reference to Japanese language classes is in accord with the general policy of W. R. A. in relating project activity to relocation. Opportunities are open to qualified people in interpreting and translating Japanese. Such persons may enter the language school of Army Intelligence, teach either in Army Intelligence School

## SEND XMAS BOXES FOR MEN OVERSEAS BEFORE OCTOBER 15

Christmas packages may be sent to soldiers overseas from September 15 to October 15 without the usual request, it is announced on a United States Army Postal Service bulletin.

However, the packages must not weigh more than five pounds. They must not exceed fifteen inches in length or thirty-six inches in length and girth com-

bined.

## PASS REGULATION

### Johnston Guarantees Enforcement

"It has been suggested that I call attention again to the regulations about leaving the center without a pass, and to state the

penalty for the violation of this regulation," declared Project Director Ray D. Johnston yesterday.

The only area not subject to pass restriction is the wooded area just west of the center which is a part of the Rohwer Relocation center. Leaving the center for any other places will require passes. These passes cannot be issued for fishing or swimming and will only be considered when needed for work purposes or something of an emergency nature.

Johnston feels that it is the responsibility of his office to furnish adequate protection to the center residents, as well as to see that the WRA regulations are properly observed. Persons leaving the center without passes are entirely without protection from the WRA.

"Violations of this WRA pass regulation are subject to a minimum penalty of one week in jail, emphasized the project director, "and we shall strictly enforce this penalty in the future."

## ADULT EDUCATION ADDS NEW CULTURAL COURSES

Titles of the new courses with brief descriptions are as follows:

Types of topics include: kinds of food necessary to health of adults and children; the necessary quantity of the basic foods; food shortages caused by the war; how ration points affect buying. Mothers
