NISEI SOLDIER FROM ATTU HERE

Among the many servicemen now visiting the Center is Sgt. William Nishikawa, who saw action in the Aleutians. Attached to the Interpretation Headquarters, Sgt. Nishikawa was stationed for 16 months at Attu. Here on a 30-day furlough, he is visiting his relatives in Block 8.

Sgt. Nishikawa, formerly of Stockton, volunteered into the army in February, 1941. He received his basic training at Ft. Lewis, Wash., and later graduated from the Persidio in San Francisco.

He will leave on Dec. 3 for Camp Savage, Minn., where he will await further orders.

The National Honor Society of Rohwer high school, along with the Junior National Honor Society, started a Center-wide War Bond and Stamp drive Monday, to continue through Dec. 5. The goal is one jeep, calling for \$1165 invested in War bonds. With "Rohwer Center High School" on it, the jeep will be sent to the 100th Infantry, composed entirely of Japanese Americans, in Italy.

Students will sell the stamps and bonds at the schools and to the blocks, while NHS members will sell to the administrative personnel.

According to Shinya Honda, president of NHS, in addition to the big event of donating a jeep, added attractions planned for the campaign include a "surprise" for all the students; a prize of \$1 for the boy and girl selling the most bonds and stamps; trip to McGehee to all those selling more than \$100 worth; and a half-day holiday for homeroom making most sale.

The Blue Devil-Bronco game turned out to be one of those typical Nisei style of contest as both were stubborn on defense and lacking that certain scoring punch.

The Broncos, who were odds-on favorite and who were out-playing the courageous Blue Devils throughout most of the game, capitalized on the only break to score the winning marker. Junji Sasaki on his touchdown jaunt had a hole, a mile wide and went over standing up with three-would-be tacklers hanging on.

The Broncos' forward wall led by "Kanaka Joe" Sakasegawa, Hank Okura and Yuta Matsumoto, who had a huge edge over their rival as the statistics clearly indicated. Sakasegawa not only caught both Bronco passes but was also a "Rock of Gibraltar" on defense.

But the pass defense of the victors was very much in doubt as the Blue Devils completed five passes and had several others miss because of the butter-finger on the part of the receivers.

Bad Center Paves Way for Lone Score; Blue Devils Put Up Game Fight

A stubborn and fighting Blue Devils eleven fought off the on-slaught of the powerful Broncos for forty-five minutes, before a bad pass from center spelled defeat for them, as the Broncos cashed in on the break to win, 6-0.

With the game nearing its climax and a score-less tie in sight; center Gary Shiota let loose a high pass that went over Joey Noma's head, who was standing

For the Blue Devils, Kiyoto Ohata and Joey Noma stood out in the backfield with Its Ryuto and George Tomota, outstanding in the line.

Leading ground gainer of the day were Nobu Tanimoto and Junji Sasaki, who together netted 104 yards.

If the Blue Devils' receivers were only able to hang on to some of the passes thrown by Ohata or Noma, it might have been a different story.

He asked if she would accompany him to the movies? She demurely wished Ocean Park or Venice. Genzo threw out his chest. "My car is outside." She shyly slipped her arm thru his while the moon dimmed in sad consternation.

Ocean Park thronged with gaiety; elderly couples retracing their moments of happiness. Now and then people would look askance at this strange allegiance. Genzo being ignorant and stupid was completely oblivious to his environment. Genzo squander his money, taking in the sights. Arriving at the dipper he hesitated, till she squeezed his arm saying, "Its fun to ride in one of those."

ベスト氏の言に依ると、軍及WR Aは千月初旬、案所内トラアルメーカ一の搬入を行つてをり、WR A所内警察官エドワードボーベツタは四日の騒動で負傷した。現在行政区域は高い垣で日本人居住区域から完全に遮断されてゐる。軍隊が入つて以来日本本物人は行政事務所へ来つて来たかうたし、かして若る火曜日以來炭灰人夫食物運搬及カベジクル一等少数が働いてゐる日本人區域へ護衛なしに行く事は禁ぜられてゐる。

其の意見では立退者の大部分はWR A又は軍部の權威を疑はないと

鶴湖訪問の十一月一日におきた局長の予定は次の日迄日本人代表と会見せむ事になつてゐた。しかし食事の時金食堂に於てマイヤー氏の演説を聞く為行政区域へ全住民の行く様アナウンスされた。かくして三五〇〇一四〇〇〇人の大人女子供は行政ビル前にあしかけた。組織せられた約二百名の青年は群衆の行動を指
