

RELOCATION NEWS AND FILMS

Up-to-date information on relocation opportunities throughout the country will be made available to Center residents next week with the arrival of the WRA team of relocation advisers, who will be here from Dec. 1 to Dec. 11.

Members of the team are Harold Fistere, Cleveland relocation supervisor; Elmer Shirrell, Chicago relocation supervisor; Dr. P. A. Weber, Japanese language expert from the Salt Lake City office; Philip Barber of the Washington Relocation division; and Miss Gretchen VanTassel of the Reports division in Washington.

They will meet with Rohwer residents at a series of afternoon and evening meetings in various sections of the Center. There will be talks on various phases of relocation, including a discussion of public attitudes, cost of living reports, housing conditions, job opportunities, and specific information about various relocation areas. Question and answer periods will complete the program, and there will be an exhibit of photographs and charts.

Afternoon meetings will be held with various occupational groups such as agricultural workers, office workers, professional people and mechanical tradesmen.

WHITAKER, NEW JEROME HEAD

E. B. Whitaker will replace Paul A. Taylor as Project Director of the Jerome relocation center, Dillon S. Myer, national director of WRA, announced Tuesday.

Whitaker, who has been serving as field assistant director of WRA at Little Rock ever since the Arkansas relocation centers were established, will assume management of the Jerome center in addition to his present duties.

Taylor, who is resigning to accept a post with the United States Department of Agriculture in Washington, will relinquish his position at Jerome on Dec. 1.

High-lighting the 10-day visit of the group will be the first showing of two sound movies depicting the life of former residents of relocation centers who are now permanently resettled.

The movies are: "Go for Broke," a story of the Japanese American Combat team in training at Camp Shelby.

"The Way Ahead," a story of relocated evacuees. Photographed in many parts of the country, it depicts evacuees at work, in their

homes, and joining in the life of their communities. A Japanese translation for the narrative part of this film is being planned.

"This will be a fine opportunity for Rohwer residents to ask the many puzzling questions that have been on their minds in regard to relocating, and to get first-hand information on the opportunities in various parts of the country," said Project Director Ray D. Johnston, in commenting on the team's arrival.

Auto Accident Hits Rohwer

The first major traffic accident involving Rohwer Center evacuees occurred Tuesday at 5:10 p.m. on Highway 1, by the Coon Bayou bridge which is about five miles south of the Center.

Rohwer residents involved in the accident were L. A. May, Project steward and driver of the government pickup truck, and passengers Mrs. Fude Yamaguchi, wife of F. Yamaguchi, foreman of the Rohwer Tofu factory; Mrs. Teruko Usui, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Yamaguchi; Mrs. Sumiko Yamaguchi; Harry Usui; Tsugio Fujimoto; and Eddie Nagayama.

Mrs. Usui was fatally injured when she was thrown out of the car. She passed away from internal injuries Wednesday morning at 5:30 o'clock at the Center hospital. Twenty years old, she had married Thomas Usui of Block 40 several months ago.

Also thrown out of the car, others injured were Mrs. F. Yamaguchi of Block 34, with a broken shoulder bone; Mrs. S. Yamaguchi, with a lacerated face; and Nagayama, with minor cuts and bruises. May, Usui and Fujimoto escaped unharmed.

The truck driven by May was struck on the right front door section by a van

of the Parker Transfer Truck Company of Dermott, Ark., driven by George Sasser.

May was driving back from McGehee to the Center with his six passengers, after some of the party had shopped for material for the Rohwer Tofu factory. As he neared the narrow Coon Bayou bridge his vision was impaired by dust from a preceding car. When he was near the bridge, he saw a transfer truck approaching from the opposite foot of the bridge. He tried to stop his truck, when both right wheels struck loose gravel. The car was swung straight across the road and squarely in front of the oncoming truck. The van hit May's truck, which made a complete U-turn back to the original spot and then plunged into the ditch. The impact tore open the doors and threw out the four passengers. They were picked up by another passing car and taken straight to the Center hospital.

Funeral arrangements for Mrs. Usui will be held today at 2 p.m. in PS hall 20. Among the relatives and friends attending the funeral will be her brother, Nobuo Yamaguchi, of New York, and brother-in-law, Dr. Usui, of Omaha, Neb.
