

COOP MEMBERS HOLD MEETING

PERSONNEL SETUP

Reorganization of the Project administrative setup will take place today, in accordance with new WRA rulings, reported Francis R. Mangham, assistant project director in charge of Administrative management.

"The Project Employment division will be officially abolished and, in its place, the Relocation division will be established to handle evacuee relocation and all types of leaves. E. B. Moulton, former employment officer, will head the division as relocation

program officer. Hershel Abbott, former leave officer, will be assistant relocation program officer; Lillian Morrow, former statistician, will be leave officer," he said.

The personnel section will also be abolished and a personnel management section will be created to perform all duties previously handled by the personnel section and that part of the Employment pertaining to evacuee employment, placement and training. Joseph B. Coleman, former placement officer, will head the section as acting personnel officer. Edwin R. Bethune, former registrar, will be personnel technician; Eloise Hays, former junior personnel officer, will be transaction officer.

The Relocation division will report directly to the Project director; the personnel management section will be a part of the Administrative Management division.

WRA TO HOLD DENVER MEET

Project administration, with emphasis on WRA budget and appropriation problems for the last half of fiscal year 1944 and fiscal year 1945, will be discussed at the Conference on Administrative Management of WRA to be held Dec. 6-11 at Denver, Colo. Fiscal year 1944 ends on June 30, 1944.

Francis R. Mangham, assistant project director, and Ralph Estes, cost accountant, will leave here Saturday to attend the conference. All the projects will be represented. Leland Barrows, assistant director of WRA, Washington D.C., will be chairman.

ENGLISH-SPEAKING COUNTRIES GUILTY OF RACIAL PREJUDICE

MINNEAPOLIS STAR JOURNAL, Nov. 17--Although the English-speaking people are against the doctrine of racial superiority, some of the worst practices of that doctrine outside Germany are found in English-speaking countries--in the American south and British South Africa and India--Norman Thomas, four times Socialist party presidential candidate, said Tuesday night at an inter-racial forum at the Free Methodist church.

"Although the legal situation has been improving for the Negro in America," Thomas said, "popular custom has lagged far behind with the result that racial strains between white and black are more pronounced now than at any time in the last 30 years.

Thomas cited the treatment of American-born Japanese.

"Congress and the President have created a dangerous precedent by adopting wholesale the totalitarian theories of justice by discrimination on the basis of racial affiliation," he said.

BETWEEN HUDDLES

The Jokers making its initial appearance last Sunday were far from impressive in downing the Blue Devils, 6-0.

Their highly touted attack never materialized as nine fumbles and numerous penalties kept them in a hole during most of the afternoon.

Penalties were also responsible for giving the losers its only scoring chance. Joker's forward wall, which outplayed and outcharged the opponent through greater part of the game, made a gallant goal line stand by stabbing off four smashing thrusts on the five yard line.

Outstanding player of the game was undoubtedly Teruo "Mortimer" Tsujimoto, Joker's guard, who's blocked punt led to Pete Furuya's recovery and touchdown. Tsujimoto, playing like his famed brother "ChooChoo" was invincible on defense

crashed in to block Joey Noma's attempted fourth down punt from his own 20 yard line. As the ball bounded toward the Blue Devils' goal, Joker's Pete Furuya picked up the ball and stepped into the end zone. Kenny Ige's try for extra point was not good.

The Blue Devils had two golden opportunities to put over a score. Immediately following the second half kick-off, they marched 61 yards on the ground of which 40 yards were aided by penalties, but only to be halted on the Joker Y's five yard strip. The Y's hard charging forward wall rose to its greatest height of the game in turning back this touchdown drive of the Blue Devils.

Their second chance came in the fourth quarter as the Blue Devils' passing attack went into high gear. Sat Oune and Gabriel Ohata threw four completed passes, three of the aerial to end Tak Tahara, the newest lightweight league sensation, as they drove 57 yards before bogging down on the Y's 21 yard line.

The Joker Y's had a number of scoring opportunities, but costly fumbles at crucial times ruined their goalward drive.

The only ball packer to gain consistently was Joker Y's plunging quarterback, Ty Kajimoto, who marked off 30 yards in 8 tries. In the Y's line, Tada Endo, Teruo Tsujimoto and Kenny Ige were outstanding.

The Blue Devils' passing game was their only bright spot. In their two league games against the Broncos and the Joker Y's, Coach Furuoka's squad have shown that they are the best passing team in the league.
