## PART OF EVACUEE PAYROLL WILL BE PAID BY CHECKS

Because of reduction in Center agent cashier authority and in order to expedite the payment of evacuee salaries, a part of the November evacuee payroll will be paid by check, reported Francis R. Mangham, assistant project director, yesterday.

### Team to Recruit Men for MISLS.

To recruit candidates for the MIS language School, Camp Savage, Minn., Captain Rusch and two sergeants will arrive at the Center Wednesday.

During their visit here, they will interview all interested nisei and kibei. It was stated during previous recruitments that, "Enrollment in the school calls for no difficult prerequisites. Any male who can understand Japanese is qualified, and a good round knowledge of Japanese is not necessarily required. The men are trained to be language specialists."

The groups to be paid by checks are the Engineering section, Agricultural division, and Motor transportation and Maintenance section.

Totaling \$15,000, the payroll of these groups will be mailed to the Treasury Disbursing Office at Kansas City, Mo. The checks will then be mailed directly to the employees at their respective addresses, in the same manner as clothing allowance checks. They should be arriving on about Dec. 13," he said.

The remainder of the evacuee payroll will be paid in cash by agent cashiers in the usual manner, Mangham stated.

ing the Japanese American Combat team in training at Camp Shelby.

At Thursday night's meeting, the three main speakers were Dr. Weber, Fister and Shirrell.

Speaking in both English and Japanese, Dr. Weber related his experiences during his residence of over 30 years in Japan. "Technically, the Japanese are our enemies, but I've known them and they are very fine people. After the war is over, I hope to visit Japan and renew all my old acquaintances," he said.

Fister indicated that the question most asked by evacuees is, "What is the general attitude of the public?" In response to this, he said that "Are you loyal?" is the question that most concerns the outside American public. "With an unqualified 'yes' as the answer by the evacuees, the majority of the population in the Mid-

west and East is willing to accept evacuees on a face value basis. The Mid-western newspaper are favorable in their reaction, and he suggested that evacuees stop reading California and Hearst papers. Many jobs, professional, skilled and unskilled, are available. Also, schools and churches are open to relocated evacuees. Housing conditions seem to be the most serious problem," he said.

Speaking on relocation in the Chicago area, Shirrell said that, "There are ample opportunities for jobs. The evacuees' chief problem is finding permanent housing. The cost of living is up to the evacuees, and may range from \$40 to \$250 per month per family or from \$4 to \$10 a week for a single man. The outstanding accomplishment by WRA is the placement of evacuees in jobs in which they were adopted prior to evacuation."
