It is always good to talk about cool subjects when it is hot and of hot subjects when it is cold. Since it is cold now I shall fill the space up with something hot...

"Why did a moron take a bucket of water to his employer?"

"Because he was ready to get fired!!!"

But now, getting away from the corn...When I picked up a recent issue of the Poston Chronicle, my eyes were stopped by the news of the barrack fire. Beyond the headline, the article went on to relate the sad story of the two barracks that were burnt and of the evacuees that were involved. According to the article, one of the barracks was razed to the foundation in a matter of minutes...so fast that not a personal effect of the evacuees was removed.

Very sad indeed...the properties lost were perhaps the lifelong accumulation of the evacuee s. Can't you imagine these people just standing helplessly, seeing their cherished belongings and lifelong treasures go up in smoke? These pre-war properties condensed into small bundles by evacuation...containing only those articles deemed important...now being reduced to ashes...To those people, the world may seem dark, desolate, and maybe wicked...it is a pity...

To me the significance of the story was not only because it concerned a family I knew, but the same thing can and will happen here if we are not careful. That incident was something remote way out in Arizona, but the dreadful part is it may be repeated here. With the cold weather, we are apt to overheat our stoves or by various other means of carelessness, a fire may be started. Our oil-paper covered barracks are poten-

## Game to Start Second Round; Both Squads Hampered by Injury

Starting off the second round of the Rohwer lightweight league will see the revamped Broncos meeting the twice beaten Blue Devils this afternoon, starting at 2 o'clock on the Senior high school gridiron.

Today's game is a crucial one for the injury riddled Broncos, for they must win today in order to keep pace with the undefeated and untied Los Angeles Joker Y's.
