Music, music, music... It's funny, this thing called music... just an intricate arrangement of notes, yet it has a strange power to enchant, and also to soothe the restless feelings of the day.

Just a few months ago, while working on the canal, we had our luncheon on the levee one day. It was warm, not a cloud in sight, and the buzzards were soaring lazily in the blue sky. Below me was a cotton field. 'midst the green leaves and snow-like cotton, a family of negro was working. Somehow, this scene interested me...it was like a dream picture--half clear, half obscure. It was funny why this scene interested me, for 'til evacuation, my life was the seashore, with the breaking surf and flying spray. I have never known the beauty of a rural scene or of a rural life. Then from nowhere I seem to hear the strains of Foster's music. Something which I had learned in the grade schools. I have always liked it whether it was the "Swanee River" or "Old Black Joe." But a certain something was always lacking. Then here, overlooking a typical southern scene, I seemed to feel a revived beauty of the songs. I have only seen cotton fields and such in geography books, but here was a genuine picture. I had to come and observe a real scene before I got the real meaning.

In our relocation life, the same holds true for us. The same has held true in the past, but by the authorities seeing only part of our picture, we, the Japanese Americans were

Then there were and are various committees and other leaders like our friend, Mr. B.... But do not facts show that these people do not see the full picture; that they have only seen half or less of our picture? Our merits as good citizens can be shown clearly by the recent

And to those politicians who thinks that, in a course of human events, it becomes necessary to cheat once in a while, as they did the Nisei, I have this to say..."Even fools are hard to fool twice."
