## 40 Students to Receive Diplomas

Friday night at 8 o'clock, forty Rohwer high school students will march up to receive their diplomas during the commencement exercises at the high school auditorium in Block 35. The third group to graduate from Rohwer high school, the boys will be

attired in dark blue caps and gowns, the girls in white caps and gowns.

The theme is "To Strive, to Seek, to Find—and not to Yield." Student speakers will be Shigeko Nakano, addressing on "To Strive;" Yas Miyao, "To Seek;" Salutatorian Keiko Ootoshi,

"To Find;" and Valedictorian Satoshi Oishi, "And Not to Yield."

Henry Nishioka, class president, will preside.

Diplomas will be awarded by J. A. Trice, superintendent of education. Presentation of Class for awards will be made by William M. Beasley, high school principal; while PTA awards will be made by Mrs. Mae Honda.

## Schools Open Doors to Nisei

State universities of Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and Missouri are now open to evacuee students, reported Thomas Bodine, field director of student relocation, who was in the Center Friday and Saturday.

Private institutions opened to them include Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Cornell, Columbia and the University of Chicago.

Center students desiring to continue their education in universities or private institutions are advised to write first for full particulars to the Student Relocation Council, 1201 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, 7, Pa., said Bodine who helped and advised the high school seniors seeking collegiate or technical education.

"For 1944, the various church groups are making available the same sums for scholarships which were available last year. For students who are not church members, there is the World Student Service funds totaling \$14,000. In the past year, 2,000 nisei and sansei students have relocated for matriculation at 350 different schools, colleges and universities," he said.

Bodine left Rohwer Saturday night and will return sometime in March to speak to the graduating students.

Invocation will be given by Dr. J. B. Hunter; benediction by the Rev. K. Harper Sakaue. Masako Tabuchi will play the processional and the recessional.

## TWO DELEGATES TO ATTEND CONFERENCE

Shigenori Tamaki, chairman of the Community council, and Frank Miahkawa, assistant farm superintendent, were chosen delegates from this center to represent Rohwer at the coming national Relocation conference in Chicago.

The Community council has resolved to have three separate meetings for the conference, according to Chester Fujino, secretary of the council. The resolution is to have a meeting of evacuee delegates and representatives from the relocation areas. The first two meetings will be held without the presence of Dillon Myer, national director of WRA.

The third and final

meeting will include both groups with the presence of Myer, when the problems of relocation and the future of evacuees will be thoroughly discussed.

The proposed conference is being held at the request of various relocation centers Community councils, including that of Heart Mountain and Rohwer. The conference was proposed in order to discuss how to approach WRA in regards to problems of relocation centers.

The national conference will be attended by 30 delegates in all, 18 from the relocation centers and 12 from the various relocation areas, especially Salt Lake City, Denver and Chicago.

## GARAGE WORK FOR 200 MEN

A call for about 200 inexperienced mechanics was made by the Transportation Maintenance Corporation in Chicago, Ill. through Ted Kawachi, recruiter for the corporation, who was in the Center yesterday and Monday. Employment is offered in the servicing department of the Checkers and Yellow cabs.

At present, 40 nisei boys, including three relocatees from Rohwer center, are employed in the corporation's servicing department and three nisei girls in the office.

Wage arrangements are as follows: schooling department for apprentices and inexperienced mechanics--\$35 per week on a 54-hour basis; semi-experienced mechanics--\$40 per week on a 54-hour basis; experienced mechanics--paid on piece work basis, minimum of 54 hours.

Housing facilities are guaranteed before the accepted workers leave the Center.

## P.O. REPORTS FOR DECEMBER

In December, \$41,236.81 were handled by the local post office.

Stamp sales amounted to #3,343.18; 1040 C.O.D. were received amounting to \$6,284.84 with fees of \$94.34; 1034 C.O.D. were delivered amounting to \$6,044.48 with fees of \$89.68; and 3103 money orders were issued amounting to \$28,416.19 with fees of \$307.28.

## ARIZONA LAW RULED OUT

An Arizona law requiring public notice of business dealings with persons whose movements are restricted by law was held unconstitutional by the Arizona Supreme Court in a decision handed down on December 13. The statute was enacted by the Arizona legislature early this year.

The constitutionality of the law was challenged by Teutomu Ikeda and three other litigants in the Maricopa County Superior Court, which declared that the law unconstitutionally discriminated against persons of Japanese ancestry and others whose movements are restricted by law. The case was appealed to the Arizona Supreme Court by Joe Conway, Arizona Attorney General.

Relocation Officer Laverne Madigan from New York is here to stay for three weeks to interview residents interested in relocating in that area.

## PASSPORTS FOR EAST COAST NISEI SEAMEN NOW ISSUED

Recent difficulties experienced by nisei evacuee seamen shipping from East Coast ports due to the fact that they were not permitted to ship out without seamen's passports is beginning to be solved as the first few passports are coming through from the State Department. The solution was arrived at through the joint action of the WRA and the various interested Government agencies, with the support of the maritime unions of which the seamen are members.

Shortly after the seamen were released from the WRA centers and in most cases had already made at least one trip on the high seas with supplies to our fighting forces abroad and to our Allies, an old ruling which had been issued as a security measure immediately after Pearl Harbor pro-

hibiting American citizens of Japanese descent as well as Japanese nationals from leaving ports of the United States without a valid passport was applied to them. Since the nisei seamen, who had no knowledge of the existence of such a ruling, had been shipping out up to this time, like the majority of the American seamen, with "APPLIED FOR" stamps on their papers in lieu of the actual passports applied for, Customs officials were required by the State Department ruling to pull the boys off ships intending to leave to coast of the United States.

Upon investigation by all the East Coast maritime unions, the CIO Maritime Committee in Washington, the Japanese American Committee for Democracy and the United Japanese American Seamen's Victory Club
