

## TULE LAKE: UNDER W.R.A. RULE AGAIN

Tule Lake segregation center has once again been "restored" to peaceful conditions as center is in the hands of W.R.A.

Following message was received from Washington informing of this change. "The return of the Tule Lake center to full civil administration was announced by the War Dept. and the W.R.A. following re-establishment of peaceful conditions within the center." stated Dillon S. Myer.

Released also from Washington is the fact that as soon as internal conditions can be smoothed, segregation will take place. Housing facilities are tentatively scheduled to be finished by Feb. 1, but this does not mean that segregation will take place from Feb. 1. The first group to be moved will be from Manzanar consisting of 2,000 persons.

## Center to Construct Poultry House; W.P.B. Gives Approval

"Receiving certification of approval from the War Production Board, this center will start constructing immediately, providing weather permits, a poultry house," stated Tom Makino, Assistant Supervisor of Construction and Maintenance.

This poultry house will be 20 feet wide by 100 feet long and will be located on the north side of the hospital adjoining the hog farm. Construction will take approximately a month and a half depending upon weather condition.

## Inclement Weather Hampers Center's Fuel Situation

To those blocks which are out of fuel, coal will be passed out. At the present time, 12 blocks are

already using coal. However, as soon as the weather conditions are favorable, wood will be brought in. Due to the unfavorable conditions now existing, the lumberjacking for the next 3 or 4 days will be purely voluntary. As soon as the conditions are again favorable, the holiday lumberjacking will start again, and this will continue until the Rohwer Fuel Committee feels there is an ample supply of fuel in each block for the winter season. All efforts are now being made to haul the woods out.

## NEW RULING AFFECTS CARS

Rohwer Internal Security Chief Bert Clayton announced recently that a new regulation received from Washington will go into immediate effect concerning about parking of vehicles.

The new regulation states that owners of cars hereafter can not park their cars within 25 feet of their residence or any building or fire hydrant within the Center. Also that all cars in Center be parked on the right side of the road with distance of not less than four feet between cars, and as far off the road as it is safe for them to pull out.

The local Police Department asks the cooperation of all vehicle drivers.

This matter of holiday lumberjacking is taken care of by the Rohwer Fuel Committee, composed of the various representatives from the Community council and the Block Managers.

When the regular lumberjacking commences, since rubber boots are unavailable, galoshes will be issued to relieve the workers from damp feet.
