Since the transportation supervisor in that area was not able to contact many of the evacuees with stored property in the temple, names of the evacuees whose property have been transferred for safe keeping to the government warehouse were released yesterday. ### LOCAL HI-Y TO GET CHARTER FROM YMCA.


The Rohwer high school Hi-Y's will be recognized by the National YMCA in the near future. They will receive the Hi-Y charter and card.
