## ARMY TRAINING PROGRAM SET

The third nation-wide test for candidates who wish to be considered for the Army Specialized Training Program will be given only on March 15, 1944 at 9 a.m. in Block 35. Candidates who do not take the test at that time will have no further opportunity until the next time the test is given. All high school graduates; 17-21, who have a good school record may take the test, according to Opal Albright, vocational adviser.

Those interested who failed to apply for the

test last Saturday may see Miss Albright at the high school office for special arrangements.

Taking the test does not constitute enlistment in either branch of the armed service; that is, having taken the test, a student is not obligated to enter the program if he is accepted.

Divided into three parts, the test covers knowledge and use of words, scientific questions of general knowledge, and mathematics problems. Each candidate should bring with him to

the test two soft lead pencils. Nothing else is permitted. Each student will be notified by approximately May 1 as to whether or not he has qualified on the test. However, no test scores will be reported either to students or to school authorities.

A.S.T.P. trainees are expected to receive college credits for their work. The curricula vary in length from one to eight 12-week terms, except that the medical and dental curricula are of the length in use as accredited colleges. Those who receive satisfactory scores are instructed to present those qualifying notices to Army authorities after induction.

These candidates are then sent to special Army training stations for their 13 weeks of basic military training. During this basic training period, selection is made to fill the vacancies in A.S.T.P. courses. The numbers of vacancies will vary due to the changing needs of the Army, and can be predicted for only a month or two in advance. An unsatisfactory score on this test does not exclude a candidate from being considered for the A.S.T.P.; after induction the Army General Classification Test serves as a further opportunity for eligibility.

Some of the fields of training and the branches of service to which it leads are: engineering (to be utilized by the Army Air Force, Ground Force and Service Force), medicine (to the Medical department), personnel psychology (to the Adjutant General's dept.), foreign area and language (Ground forces, Signal corps, M.I. Service, Office of Provost Marshal General), veterinary, surveying, communication, optics, and military and physical training.

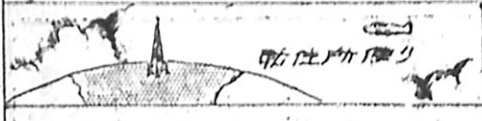
