INTERIOR DEPT. TAKES OVER W.R.A.

SECRETARY ICKES SAYS NO CHANGE IN POLICIES

The War Relocation Authority, which had been operating as an independent agency created by the executive order of the President, was transferred as a unit to the Department of the Interior. WRA Director Dillon S. Myer, WRA Washington staff and field staff will be transferred intact.

In a statement made today concerning the transfer of the WRA to the Department of the Interior, Secretary Ickes said: "War Relocation Authority has been confronted with the difficult task of caring for a minority group of enemy ancestry in time of war. To handle this problem with proper regard for the national security and in accord with sound principles of American democracy, the Authority has

developed a three-fold program: 1. Maintenance of all evacuees who require support in properly administered relocation centers; 2. Segregation of evacuees whose sympathies do not lie with the United States into a special segregation center; and 3. Relocation of loyal evacuees as rapidly as possible in normal, productive American life. This program will be continued and I hope will be made even more effective in the Department of the Interior."

Ickes added that in carrying out his responsibilities with reference to the WRA he intended to keep in mind the need for recognition of the rights of United States citizens regardless of ancestry and the internal security of the United States during

wartime. He also said that he would be reluctant to accept the responsibility for the WRA without the assurance that Myer and its staff would come under his direction as a unit.

In commenting on the transfer, Dillon S. Myer said: "We welcome the sources and facilities which will be available in the Department of the Interior to help us to do our job and do it better."

Project Director Ray D. Johnston made the following statement: "I believe that the transfer of the WRA to the Department of the Interior will be helpful both to the administration and to the evacuees, and I do not believe there will be any major changes in WRA policies and in the manner of operation of the centers."

LATEST INSTRUCTIONS RELEASED FOR PRE-INDUCTEES IN CENTER

Those young men who have received instructions from the Desha County Selective Service Board to report for Pre-induction physical examination on Saturday, Feb. 26, 1944, will go to the Leave Office on Thursday, Feb. 24, 1944. They will receive their short-term leave permits and any additional instructions at that time.

In the future, as additional men are called for their physical examinations, such persons will come to the Leave Office forty-eight hours before the date of examination. It is not necessary for the young men to contact any other office in the Center prior to their visit to the Leave Office.

It is again emphasized that any young man of draft age who is leaving the center on any type of leave over three days, must report his change of address to the Desha County Selective Service Board, McGehee, Arkansas and to the board in California where he originally registered, according to E.B. Moulton, relocation program officer.

Peacock To Give Income Tax Aid

Deputy Herren Peacock will be in the Center Tuesday and Wednesday to aid both the evacuees and the appointed personnel in filling out their 1944 income tax blanks. He may be contacted at the Project Attorney's office in Ad. building 2.

All taxpayers are asked to refer to the Feb. 12th issue of the OUTPOST as to what to bring.

Those who must file tax returns include: any single person whose total income in 1943 was \$500 or more; every husband or wife whose individual income was more than \$624;

DRAFT RULE FOR STUDENT

For high school students 18 or 19 years of age, the following Selective Service regulation was released.

Any person 18 or 19 years of age, who, while pursuing a course of instruction at a high school is ordered to report for induction during the last half of one of the academic years at school, may have his induction postponed until the end of such academic year.

A student is considered as in the last half of one of his academic years when he has matriculated therein, provided regular classroom attendance is to begin not later than one week after matriculation.

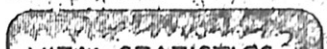

SELECTIVE SERVICE REGULATIONS, 641.1 to 641.6.

641.1 Notice of requirements of selective service law--Every person shall be deemed to have notice of the requirements of the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940 and amendments thereto upon publication by the President of a proclamation or proclamations or other pub-

641.2 Failure to take notice--(a) If a registrant or a person required to present himself for and submit to registration fails to perform any duty prescribed by the selective service law, or directions given pursuant thereto, within the required time, he shall be liable to fine and imprisonment under section 11 of the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, as amended. (b) If a registrant or any other person concerned fails to claim and exercise any right or privilege within the required time, he shall be deemed to have waived the right or privilege.

641.7 Communication by mail--It shall be the duty of each registrant to keep his local board advised at all times of the address where mail will reach him. The mailing of any order, notice, or blank form by the local board to a re-
