## SEASONAL LEAVES RESTRICTIONS RELEASED NOW

Effective immediately, no more seasonal leaves will be issued except in accord with new regulations released Monday.

This new regulation provides for release of evacuees only on seasonal agricultural work and only on government contract submitted by the Extension service or War Food Administration after approval of the district relocation officer. All inquiries for seasonal labor should be referred back to the government agency responsible for the farm labor program in the county.

Since Neighbor Extension service nor War Food Administration have procedures established for seasonal labor, it will probably be several weeks before any approved government contract will be submitted to the Center.

### Pre-Inductees To Go For Physicals

Fifty-nine local draftees will report for pre-induction Saturday. They will leave in the morning for McGehee, from where they will go to Little Rock for pre-induction physical examinations.

This will be the first group to be called from Rohwer since the reclassification of itself for Selective Service.

## WAR DEPARTMENT CALLS OFF ARMY SPECIALIZED TRAINING PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 18 (AP)--Courtesy of THE CHICAGO TRIBUNE--The army has decided to eliminate the college military training program except for advanced courses in medicine, dentistry and engineering, the war department announced today.

Because inability of selective service to deliver personnel has created a shortage of 200,000 men, the war department said, the students affected by the discontinued program will be assigned to combat units.

Before April 1, 110,000 men in the army specialized training program will be removed from colleges and assigned to active duty with troop units, leaving 35,000 students in the colleges.

The latter figure includes 5,000 pre-induction students. Those withdrawn from the program will be

men who already have completed the basic training. The 17 year olds in the ASTP reserve will not be affected.

About 80,000 of the men will be transferred from ASTP and assigned to the army ground forces "where skills and capacity for leadership now are most needed," the department said.

Most of the remaining 30,000 will be assigned to other units destined for overseas services.

## DRAFT-AGE ELIGIBLES IN OMAHA NOTIFIED FOR ARMY

Since Japanese Americans have become subject to selective service, Niseis who have relocated in the Omaha area are now being notified by the draft boards, according to THE OMAHA WORLD HERALD of Jan. 25.

I. B. Zimman, publicity director for the Omaha draft boards, said that under the new regulation selective service boards will send information forms to the Japanese Americans, and after return of the forms the war department will make individual investigations on the acceptability of each registrant.

Only after the war department has approved the individual, Zimman said, will a selective board act, and "thereafter the individuals will be processed just as any other citizen."

## Myer Speaks On Relocation

On Feb. 9, the Rohwer Community Council received the following statement from WRA Director Dillon S. Myer, regarding relocation of evacuees.

Gentlemen:

In response to requests from several of the centers for a clarification of the policy that relocation is a voluntary measure, I am glad to restate that insofar as WRA can make a commitment, relocation has been and continue to be a voluntary step within the provisions of the leave regulations. Center residents will also continue to be on a voluntary basis, except for those to whom indefinite leave is denied and who, therefore, will go to the Tule Lake Segregation Center.

It is the responsibility of the individual and his or her family to determine whether their interests and future welfare can best be served by continued residence in one of the centers, or by establishing residence outside the center in one of the many communities or localities where they are needed and where they are welcome. While our major efforts will continue to be directed towards the accomplishment of the latter objective, we feel that WRA has a responsibility to those individuals and families who may, for some reason or another, elect to remain in a center, either temporarily or for the duration. We can make no commitment to keep open any particular center for any definite period; but, insofar as we can make such a commitment, it is the intention of WRA to maintain sufficient centers for those who do not take advantage of the present opportunities.

It is my expectation that, in the very near future, the large majority of the present center residents will have made definite plans for their future and have determined where that future can be best served. It is not conceivable that any large number of those still living in the centers will decide that it is to their best interests as individuals to become a dependant group supported by the government in the restricted and abnormal life of relocation centers.

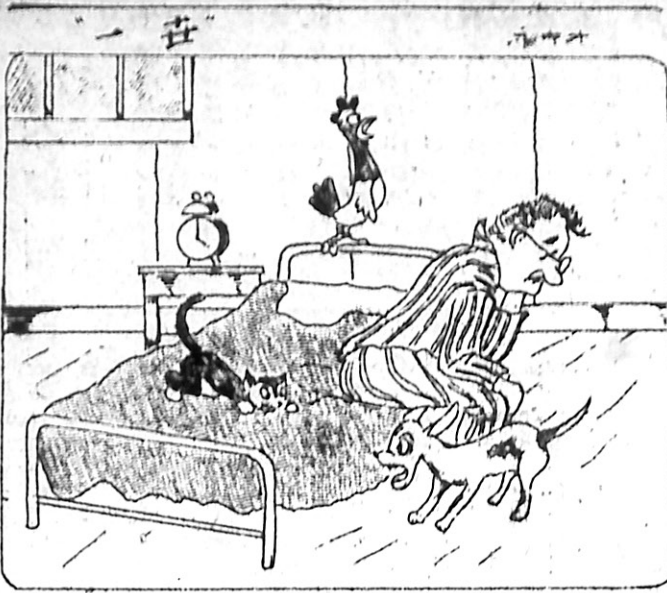
