RFCC TO PRESENT TRADITIONAL EASTER MORNING SERVICES

Far from the great white cross glistening with morning dew atop Mt. Rubidoux, far from familiar Eagle Rock, far from the serenity of the Hollywood Bowl, and far from the forbidding ser-vices at Forest Lawn, these, respectively, the devout, the biannual pet-solos will be offered Christians, and the buried ones will gather in the modest high school athletic field at 6 a.m. to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ponder the immortality of the human soul, and renew faith in God.

Rev. Kiyoshi T. Shirai will be chairman and co-chairman of the event. Nathaniel R. Griswold will speak in English and Japanese. Rev. Harner Sakauye and Roy Yoshimatsu Oyama will lead singing and pray-

ing. Boy Scouts under Mas. Kitada will usher. Parents, brothers, and sisters living in relocation centers, as well as wives and children of nisei soldiers, are eligible for servicemen's dependency benefits, it was announced today by Project Director, Ray D. Johnston.

According to advice received from the Office of Dependency Benefits of the War Department, the families of Japanese American soldiers may apply for all dependency benefits provided for under the Servicemen's Dependency Allowance Act of 1942. If the recipients of such benefits reside in relocation centers, no deductions from allowances will be made for subsistence provided by WRA.

Class A dependents, which include wives and children, are eligible for allotments on the basis of dependency and not on actual need. Only proof of marital or parental relationship will be required. Class B dependents, which include parents, grandparents, brothers, and sisters, may receive allotments only in cases where they have been dependent upon the soldier for chief or substantial support. All decisions regarding allotments and allowances including the degree of dependency and the amount to be allotted will be made by the Office of Dependency Benefits in the War Department and not by WRA.

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO RETURN FT. MISSOULA TO ARMY

The Department of Justice announced recently that it is abandoning Fort Missoula, Montana, as a detention center for alien enemies and is returning the property to the custody of the Army.

Fort Missoula has been under the jurisdiction of the Immigration and Naturalization Service since April, 1941. The first group of internees quartered there were the 483 crew members of the "Conte Biancamano", an Italian vessel which was seized shortly after the outbreak of war in the Canal Zone. It has been used exclusively for the quartering of these and other Italian seamen and for a smaller group of Japanese civilians while awaiting hearings before Alien enemy Hearing Boards. Its peak population was 2,003, reached in April, 1942.

The number of civilian internees throughout the country has declined during the last year, and the present population at Fort Missoula is only 550. These are now in process of being transferred to other detention stations.

FEDERAL AMUSEMENT TAX

An important notice of change in Federal Amusement tax was released as follows:

"Section #302 of the Revenue Act of 1943, increases the rate of tax imposed by section 1700 (a) (1) of the Internal Revenue Code on the amount paid for admission (except an admission charge of less than ten cents to a child under twelve years of age), from one cent for each ten cents or fraction thereof, to one cent for each five cents or major fraction thereof, of the amount paid for admission, effective April 1st, 1944."

Due to the one cent increase of the Federal Amusement tax (per adult), and also to the decrease of movie patrons (relocation) the Rohwer Cooperative enterprises has been compelled to either close one of its theatres, or raise the admission to eleven cents in order to meet the excessive expense involved by the above change of conditions.

After much discussion, the Board of Directors have decided to raise the admission one cent, rather than

to close one theatre which would cause much inconvenience to patrons living in that district. However, this change is temporary, and with the increase of residents from Jerome expected in the near future, the admission may be lowered to the former price of ten cents provided the change would warrant meeting the necessary expenses.




