



### JOBS HERE CUT DOWN TO 2,700

The following information was given by Ray D. Johnston, project director, concerning the present cut in the Center employment.

The cut was in accordance with the recent order from Washington. For the coming three months, the budget for the Center employment is set at 2,700 workers and since the present workers number approximately 3,100, this cut is being made.

### DRAFTEEVADEERS APPREHENDED

Takeo Shibata, 14-7-A, Sam Shimizu, 10-10-E, and Henry Tomoharu Hirata, 10-6-D, were apprehended Wednesday afternoon by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on charges of non-appearance for pre-induction physical examinations. The three 18-year-old nisei have been taken to Pine Bluff and will appear before the United States commissioner.

### ENLISTED RESERVES EXTENT OF PERIOD UNCERTAIN

In response to a request for additional information concerning placement of men in the Enlisted Reserve Corps, Ray D. Johnston, project director, has received from the Washington office a statement by the War Department. This statement is as follows: "American citizens of Japanese extraction are placed in the Enlisted Reserve Corps

upon induction for administrative reasons to channel shipments and schedule training. It is not contemplated that they will remain in the Enlisted Reserve Corps for any extended period of time."

Johnston stated that any additional information on this subject would be made public as soon as it was received.

### Youth Saves Boy From Water; Boy Safe, Hero Hospitalized

Yoshiaki Yamamoto, 19, of 6-8-D, became acquainted with the quirks of Fate and the rewards of heroes last Saturday afternoon when he rescued Tokuo Katayama, 10,

also of Block 6, from the ditch a few hundred yards west of Block 8. Katayama was riding a log in the stream which had been deepened by the recent storm when the log escaped his grasp. Yamamoto, who was in the same swimming party, plunged in and with the assistance of others, after a few uncertain moments, pulled Katayama to the east bank.

### NO SWIMMING, FISHING - M.D.

Dr. T.B. Greerof, chief medical officer, today warned residents against swimming and fishing in drainage ditches.

"Swimming in ditches is definitely to be discouraged," he said. "Consideration of what flows into the ditches is enough to make one hesitate about entering the water."

"Fishing in the streams is revolting esthetically," he said; naming catfish as particularly obnoxious.

Katayama soon went on his happy, carefree way but Yamamoto was hospitalized on Monday morning in War 8, Room 6 of the hospital with enteritis, a gastrointestinal disturbance believed caused by swallowing large amounts of the polluted water.

Dr. Nat. R. Griswold adult education head, has been transferred to the post of the head of the Community activities section. He fills a position left vacant since the departure of Margaret Sorerson, now with the Red Cross in Ireland. Helen Frasier, present curriculum advisor, will succeed Dr. Griswold as adult education head.

J. A. Trice, education head leaving next week for the navy, will be succeeded by the education head of the Jerome project, who will serve in both centers.

Johnston in an official statement to Center residents.

I also feel, however, that the block managers, block clerks and councilmen, deserve special commendation for the very fine planning and organizing which made it possible for our first census to be taken so smoothly and efficiently.

"Again, on behalf of the entire staff, I want to say that we sincerely appreciate the cooperation given by each and everyone in the Center," he concluded.

# PULITZER PRIZE WINNER SPEAKS TO ROHWERITES

John Gould Fletcher of Little Rock, Ark., winner of the 1939 Pulitzer Prize for poetry, spoke in a meeting Monday night--misdated as Tuesday night--at the YWCA club room. Mrs. Fletcher, a well-known writer of children's stories under the pen-name

of Charles May Simon, also spoke.

Fletcher, who is a student of Japanese poetry, warned Nisei against a complete aversion to Japanese culture and home customs, both believed by Fletcher worth preserving in the United States. He expressed fear that relocation has damaged the filial piety characteristic of the Japanese home.

Western Europe, he declared, is finished as the home of international culture and America must turn to the Orient, although Japanese arts have been damaged by too rapid Westernization.

Mrs. Fletcher in her talk compared the contemporary relocation camp situation to the uprooting of the Arkansas Cherokee Indians in the last century and termed them the two greatest tragedies in the history of this state.

Mr. and Mrs. Fletcher talked to school audiences.
