E. B. Moulton, relocation program officer, will leave for Chicago, Ill., tomorrow to attend a joint meeting of project relocation program officers and field relocation supervisors. He will be back on April 26.

Discussions will include relocation in general and methods for better working arrangements between the two groups.

During the absence of Moulton, Reports Officer Austin Smith, Jr. will assist in obtaining information concerning Selective Service.

CANNERY JOBS OPEN RECRUITER HERE FOR INTERVIEWS

E. Stanley Parsells, employment manager for the Deerfield Packing Corporation which is a subsidiary of the famous Seabrook Farms near Bridgeton, New Jersey, is now in the Center recruiting employees for the packing company. Parsells will be at the Leave office Monday for interviews.

At this time he is seeking 250 women workers for canning house employees; and 150 men for all kinds of work, including welders, electricians, blacksmiths, painters, truck drivers, and laborers. Women working in the cannery receive

from 50 to 55 cents per hour; and the wage for the men workers averages from 55 to 61¢ an hour, but may go as high as 93 cents an hour for mechanics, and other skilled workers are paid in proportion. Employment on a twelve month's basis is guaranteed.

Board and room in a new dormitory are now available for single workers, both men and women, at the cost of \$8 per week. All workers belong to an AFL Union and new workers are accepted after a trial period. Dues are \$2 per month.

Center residents must have joint Board clearance if possible, but if they do not have such clearance and are interested in this work, their names will be submitted to Washington for special clearance. Parsells stated that 15

Project Attorney Jack Curtis stated yesterday that he had recently received information that some evacuees had been writing directly to the Evacuee property officer, District attorneys and Police officers on the West Coast requesting the return of contraband property.

Curtis pointed out that under the present procedure, it was necessary for applications for the re-

turn of this type of property to be made through his office. He said that if the requests were sent directly to the West Coast, it would be necessary for them to be returned here before they could be approved.

The project attorney's office will be glad to give assistance and information to anyone who is interested in regaining possession of such property, Curtis said.

Speed Actions On Leave Clearances

Actions on leave clearances which are coming from the Washington office have speeded up. An average of 20 per day have been received for the past two weeks, reported E. B. Moulton, relocation program officer.

It is hoped that the majority of persons who have had hearings will receive their clearances within the next two weeks, Moulton said.

AT THE CROSSROADS.....

The "storm of Pacific conflict that has blasted irremediably apart the segregated communities and occupational frustrations and limitations of the nisei on the sun-bathed California coast and in the tall timber of the Oregon woods has brought the nisei to an unexpected crossroads in their growth toward economic and political maturity. In the last few months nisei have been forced to make decisions of tremendous moment and responsibility. They have decided, whether they shall retain faith in the democratic promises and ideals of the United States or pay fealty to the God-emperor of a more homogeneous Oriental nation. They, too many of them unequipped and naive in the ways of the world, have been forced to make life and death decisions as to where they and how they shall earn their daily bread, where they shall be buried, and the language and phonetic accent of their posterity.

CROSS BRIDGES WISELY.....

Some bridges have already been crossed, but many uncertainties loom ahead in which the solitary individual nisei will be asked to give the final word concerning his destiny in an unforgiving world. All of his future choices let him settle with mature, courageous, fact-cognizant judgement that there maybe no cause in later life for futile remorse or weakening, bitter retrospection.

Japanese American workers have been employed in the plant since January 15 and community acceptance is good. Transportation expenses of workers to the packing company will be paid by the employer, and no re-

payment is expected if a person works as long as 3 months. If an additional 3 months' work is completed, expenses back to the project will be paid by the company. Each worker signs an individual contract with the company, which sets out exactly what he is to receive and what the obligations of each are.

The plant is located 6 miles from Bridgeton, New Jersey, 35 miles from Philadelphia, and 45 from Atlantic City. A school for plant workers is provided by the company.

The Seabrook Farms is a parent organization which owns the Deerfield Packing Corporation and several other subsidiary companies. It is the largest vegetable growing and processing organization in the world, producing food for the armed forces.

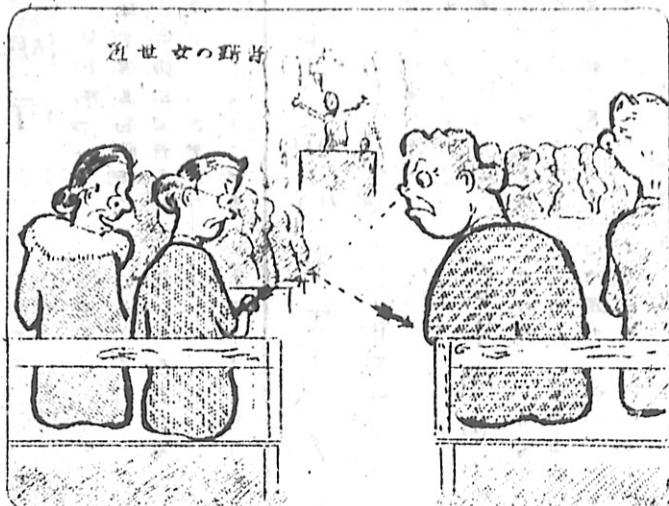
