SEGREGEEES TO BE ASSIGNED QUARTERS FOR TULE LAKE

Joe Thomas, housing representative from Tule Lake, is here today to assign quarters for all those who are going to Tule Lake on May 9 and 17. He will be at the Welfare office and each family will receive a letter advising them of the time of their appointment. Only one adult member of the family need come. It is expected that all assignments will be completed today.

Thomas said that 3 new blocks, housing approximately 350 each, had been constructed for the new Tule Lake residents from this and other centers. Except for a few bachelors who may be scattered throughout the project, it is expected that most of the Rohwer people will be neighbors. Where a family are friends already in Tule Lake, an effort will be made to place them near their friends, if possible.

SECRETARY OF WAR REASON OF NISEI IN ENLISTED RESERVES

In a recent letter to Secretary of the Interior Harold Ickes, Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson explained why Japanese Americans are being placed in the Enlisted Reserve Corps.

Stimson informed that because of the small number of Japanese Americans being inducted at this time, it was necessary to let them accumulate in the Reserve Corps until a sufficient number, usually

2500 JEROME RESIDENTS TO TRANSFER TO ROHWER

Beginning June 14, 2,500 evacuees at the Jerome center will transfer to Rohwer Center in groups of 250, according to the schedule of general transfer movements released by the Denver Tribune on April 25.

The 10 motor trips to Rohwer will be made on the afternoons of the following days: June 14, 15, 16, 19, 21, 22, 24, 26, 27 and 28. Each of the 10 motor convoys coming here

will be composed of passenger trucks, passenger cars, ambulance, trucks for baggage and household goods, wreckage and tow truck and escort vehicles.

The remaining 3,000 Jerome residents will transfer to other relocation centers as follow: Columbia River, 2,000, in groups of 500 on June 13, 18, 20 and 23; Granada, 500, on June 17; Heart Mountain, 500, on June 12.

AGED SEGREGEEES TO GET PULLMAN

All persons under 65 years of age who are going to Tule Lake and believe that they are too ill to travel by day coach are requested to contact Virginia Bayliss, medical social worker, at the hospital.

Physical examinations will be given these persons to determine whether they are pullman cases. This request applies only to those who have not already been interviewed and examined.

160 DENSONEERS TO COME BY TRUCKS

The 160 people from Jerome who will make up part of the second train leaving on May 17 will be brought here by truck on that date. Day coaches loaded with the 140 persons from the Granada center will be picked up there enroute to Tule Lake.

Sleeping accommodations for pullman cases will be reserved for the Granada and Jerome residents on the pullman coaches which will make up part of the original train at Rohwer.

San Francisco: The Message of Secretary Ickes

(Continued from Wednesday)

"We must all face the problem of the eventful status and treatment of those Americans of Japanese descent who were taken from their homes and transported to evacuation camps. Most of them, after a thorough investigation, the doubts being resolved in favor of segregating them, have been proved to be loyal and devoted to this Nation. It is intolerable to think that these people will be excluded from a normal life in this country for long. It is intolerable to think that merely because they resided on the West Coast--in California, or Washington, or Oregon--they must be wards of the Government for one moment longer than the necessities of war require. I know of no vice in these three States which has infected them so that they must be treated differently than the Japanese Americans who reside in other States. And it is intolerable to think that decent people would suggest that this Nation would for a moment consider sending loyal Americans of Japanese descent to a land which most of them have never seen and in which most of them have no interest.

"To a large extent this is a local problem. It is a problem for you people in California, in Washington and in Oregon. I hope that the clamor of those few among you who are screaming that this situation should be resolved on the basis of prejudice and hate will soon be overwhelmed by the stern remonstrances of those among you--an overwhelming majority--who believe in fair play and decency, Christianity, in the principles of America, in the Constitution of the United States!"


