### BAGGAGE INSPECTION ON 4-5, FREIGHT 7-8

## HIGH SCHOOL HAS OPEN HOUSE 5th

The Rohwer schools will hold the third open house on May 5. The elementary and the secondary schools will open from 9 to 11 in the morning, 2 to 4 in the afternoon, and from 7 to 9 in the evening.

All residents, especially the parents and friends of the school children are urged to attend. The rooms will have on display, the works of the students, including art works and handicrafts. There will also be booklets and diagrams on the various fields of study. The art room is especially interesting as it is exhibiting the materials developed in the classes, many of which are very unusual and unique.

It has just been announced that all freight and checkable baggage will be inspected here before shipment to Tule Lake. Inspection will be made by the army as nearly as possible in accordance with the following schedule.

Freight will be inspected and picked up on Thursday and Friday, May 4th and 5th. Checkable baggage will be inspected and picked up on Sunday and Monday, May 7th and 8th. Each block will be notified in advance as to the approximate time the inspection and pick up of freight and baggage will be made. Instructions will be issued later for train leaving May 17. Hand baggage will not be inspected here.

Crating and packing should be completed before the dates set out above except that covers should not be nailed on boxes and crates; also cartons and bundles should be left open.

Inspections will be made in the blocks and immediately following the inspection the owner will nail covers on the boxes and crates and securely bind the cartons, bundles, etc. The items will then be picked up by the freight and baggage crews. The freight will be delivered to the warehouse for later shipment to Tule Lake and the baggage will be delivered to the baggage cars that will be a part of the segregation train.

The freight schedule has been arranged so that all freight from Rohwer should arrive at Tule Lake during the period June 16 to June 24, 1944.

### MORE MEN GO TO INDUCTION

Civil service examinations will be given in the Center tomorrow and Friday by J. N. Sugg, U.S. Civil service examiner from the Little Rock office. Open to all Nisei 16 years of age and over who wish to obtain civil service ratings, the simplified examinations will include three types: clerical, typing and stenographic.

All those interested in taking the tests may file applications with Miss Brown, high school commercial teacher, at 35-8-A, immediately.

Schedule for the examinations follows: Thursday nite--7:00; Friday morning--8:30, afternoon --2:00, night--7:00.

# Sec'y Ickes Scores Again

The following statement by Secretary of the Interior Harold L. Ickes was made public today in connection with the relocation of Japanese American citizens and friendly law-abiding of Japanese descent from WRA centers in the west to locations in the middle west and east:

Within the past two weeks the American people heard three high public officials giving voice to opinions that seem ominously out of tune in a nation that is fighting for the principles of democracy and freedom.

First the Governor of New Jersey, then the Governor of Ohio, and now, of all people, the Mayor of New York City, have expressed a belief that American citizens of Japanese ancestry and law-abiding Japanese aliens are not entitled to the same privileges as non-Japanese and should be accorded special treatment.

This is a strange fife and drum corps to be playing the discordant anthem of racial discrimination. Stranger by far than fiction. The Mayor of New York City, who has fought long and vigorously for racial equality and justice, carrying the flag, must be shocked and disturbed to find the drummer boy from New Jersey on his left and the fifer from Ohio flanking him on the right. I cannot but believe that he has joined this company through accident and misunderstanding rather than by deliberate choice.

Mayor LaGuardia has protested against the relocation of persons of Japanese ancestry in New York City, apparently on the theory that these people are dangerous and subversive. Actually there has not been one proven case of sabotage on the part of a Japanese American since the war began—not even in Hawaii. The people who are being relocated from War Relocation Authority centers have been painstakingly checked and

For those who will be relocating, the following information was released:

The Travelers' Aid Service, which has a desk in most railroad and bus stations, may be of great value to the outgoing Conter residents. Various kinds of information concerning housing and transportation facilities are provided. Assistance is given in locating friends, relatives, or WRA officials. Also, help is given in inexperienced, elderly, or young travelers. This might be particularly helpful where the traveler does not speak much English or where plans for meeting have been disrupted. Assistance will also be given when a person becomes ill enroute, when tickets or money for maintenance is lost, or when plans in general cannot be carried out.

The Travelers' Aid will help in changing from one train to another and when problems arise because of late trains or changes in schedules.

(Con't. from page 1) transmitting set, signal devices, codes, ciphers, cameras, hunting knives, and black jacks or "saps." (No other knives except hunting knives will be picked up; no other radios except those having a frequency of over 1750 and under 540 kilocycles will be picked up).

All checkable baggage and freight will be inspected by WRA for government property such as blankets, comforters, cots, hand tools, etc.
