



THIRD SEGREGATION STARTS

Counseling Program For Relocation Aid Initiated

Facilities have now been established for an individual and family counseling program to enable the residents of the Center to discuss their present situations and future needs. This service is a part of a national program including all the relocation centers, reported E. B. Moulton, relocation program officer.

The future WRA program depends on accurate knowledge as to the needs of the evacuees, Dillon Myer, WRA director, has pointed out that proper and adequate planning for the people can be assured only by the accumulation and presentation of complete facts about each individual and family.

The counseling program is the joint responsibility of the Welfare section and the Relocation division. Everyone who feels a need for counseling as to his present situation and his future plans is urged to seek this service. Those who are interested in relocation and feel that relocation is the basis for their future plans should contact the Relocation division at 42-2-C for an appointment with one of the Relocation interviewers.

Those who have problems in relation to their future plans are urged to seek an opportunity to discuss their plans with the Welfare section at 42-7-2.

Since the agency program of the future concerns all residents of all centers, it is important that ultimately all individuals seek an opportunity to discuss their future needs and future plans with the Welfare section of the Relocation division.

Relocation Div. Moves To 42-2-C

In order to provide better service to Center residents, the Relocation division is moving to larger quarters in Barrack 2 of Block 42. E. B. Moulton, relocation program officer, announces that the division will be closed for business on Tuesday, while the move is being made. On Wednesday, the relocation division will be found in the new location.

Moulton announced an addition of three Relocation interviewers to the staff. Mrs. Mary Lue Cochran and Emily B. Moores are already at the Center. Polly DeWoes is expected to report on May 6.

No Food May Be Taken In Coaches

The third segregation movement from Rohwer will be started next week as the first group entrains for Tule Lake Tuesday, according to schedule: A throbbing crowd, including school students, will be at the gates to see off the segregees.

Another procedure ruling for the segregees, regulations prohibiting food being taken into coaches by the Tule Lake passengers will be strictly enforced. No food may be taken into the coaches with the exception of fruit and an adequate supply of this will be provided, according to Ray D. Johnston, project director.

It was explained that this policy was necessary because on several trains more than half of the people became ill from eating food that they had brought with them and a serious problem resulted.

PLANS FOR THIS YEAR'S SUMMER PROGRAM SET UP

With a chance for older and younger persons to work and play together creatively, the staffs of the Education and the Community activities have planned a Summer Program for the residents of the Center.

Very successfully operated last year, this year's program will follow much of last year's pattern.

The advisory committee for this program will consist of representatives from the Social Welfare, the Health, the Education, CA and from the PTA'S.

The executive committee in charge of this tremendous undertaking is composed of various school and departmental heads.

RUSH ACTIONS ON CONTRABANDS

Evacuees were informed by O. B. Wilt, transportation property officer, San Francisco, Calif., that all requests for shipment of contraband property are being acted upon as rapidly as possible.

Any delay is due to the shortage of personnel in the Police offices and State office.

Carnation Sale

Starting next week, the Rohwer YWCA will sponsor a one-week carnation sale, selling carnation boutonnieres to be worn on Mother's Day, May 14.

The girls will go around the camp, and since the proceeds are to be used for public relation work, the residents are asked to buy a flower or two.

found, on the basis of their records, to be loyal American citizens or law-abiding aliens. Approximately 800 of these people are now living in New York City. To the best of my knowledge, they have not caused the slightest trouble and I am sure they have no intention of doing so. Thus I can see no basis for the Mayor's fears or for his protests. I can only say that neither Governor Bricker nor Governor Edge is the type of badfellow that he ordinarily chooses, nor the type of thinking that most of us expect from Mayor LaGuardia.

The Governor of Ohio, the Honorable John W. Bricker, is guilty not only of prejudice but of disregard of the facts. In trying to further his Presidential aspirations before a Los Angeles audience last week, Governor Bricker expressed the opinion that after the war each West Coast community should determine for itself whether the people of Japanese ancestry should be permitted to return to their former homes. He also charged the War Relocation Authority of the Department of the Interior with releasing disloyal persons and cited as evidence the cases of 28 Japanese American soldiers who recently refused to take combat training.

In accusing WRA of releasing men who later manifested disloyalty in uniform, the Governor didn't know what he was talking about. As it happens, all 28 of the men involved in this incident were inducted into the Army before the West Coast evacuation and have thus never been under jurisdiction of the War Relocation Authority. But when the Governor told a group of Californians that they were wholly just-
