NISEI JOIN SEGREGATION RULES ACTIVE DUTY NO CAMERAS, NO TRESPASS

A number of young men who have been sworn in to the Enlisted Reserve Corps received notices today to report for active duty at Camp Robinson, Little Rock, Ark., Wednesday. These men are urged to contact the Relocation division office as soon as possible in order to arrange for their departure.

50 EVACUEES GO OUT ON SEASONAL LEAVE

Under contract with the War Food Administration, 50 Center evacuees left on seasonal leave for Naperville, Ill., Sunday.

During the train loading operations on May 17, when the second group in the third segregation movement departs, no pictures may be taken of the segre-

gation train and no spectators will be allowed outside the camp area, announced Project Director Ray D. Johnston.

NO CAMERAS

"Army regulations do not permit spectators taking pictures of segregation trains. It was noted during the loading operations of the train on May 9 that several spectators had cameras. Those with cameras are cautioned not to bring them to the train on May 17. If any cameras are displayed by spectators, the camera and the person in possession of will be taken into custody by the police authorities," Johnston warned.

KEEP WITHIN GATES

"On May 17 no one will be permitted to go inside the loading area adjacent to the train during loading operations unless they have a special pass signed by the Project Director. The spectators did not comply with the request to remain outside this area on May 9 which resulted in the loading operations being severely hampered by crowds around the cars. This request must be complied with on May 17 and anyone violating it will be subject to penalty," Johnston cautioned.

RELOCATION DIV. CLOSES

Due to the limited staff and the extra work connected with induction, the Relocation division will be closed for general business Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. It will not be possible to accept any types of leave applications on those days, reported W. B. Moulton, relocation program officer.

Attention is invited also to the following instructions: 1. Applications for short-term leave must be filed at least three working days in advance of the anticipated date of departure. 2. Applications for seasonal leave, indefinite leave (trial period), or indefinite leave must be filed at least five working days in advance of the anticipated date of departure. Applicants must have a photograph on file before the applications will be processed.

FOURTH MOVEMENT TO GO MAY 17

About 200 segregates will board the segregation train for Tule Lake Wednesday, according to schedule.

F. R. Mengham, assistant project director, announced that all freight and checkable baggage will be inspected here by the Army before shipment to Tule Lake. Freight will be inspected and picked up on Monday; checkable baggage will be inspected and picked up on Tuesday.

Crating and packing should be completed before inspection dates except that covers should not be

nailed on boxes and crates and cartons and bundles should be left open. Immediately after the inspection, all containers will be securely closed. The freight will be moved directly to warehouse and the checkable baggage to the baggage cars that will accompany the train. There is no limit on weight of complete freight shipment but on checkable baggage there is a limit of 150 pounds per full fare and 75 pounds per half fare, according to Mengham.

The following items are contrabands at Tule Lake

and cannot be transferred: firearms, weapons or any implements of war or any vital part of those, short wave radio receiving sets having a frequency of over 1750 kilocycles and under 540 kilocycles, any radio transmitting sets, signal devices, codes, ciphers, cameras, hunting knives, blackjack or "saps."

No other knives except hunting knives will be picked up. No other radios except those having a frequency of over 1750 and under 540 kilocycles will be picked up, Mengham reported.

The 16' x 4' murals, painted with poster tempera paint on wall boards, were produced in eight weeks as follows: "December 7th" by Mas Kinoshita; "Evacuation" by Teruyo Kishi; "Assembly Centers" by Mary Ihara; "To Rohwer" by Nobi Tanimoto; "The New Home" by Keyo Toyofuku; "Community Life" by Michi Tanaka; "Centor Occupations" by Motohiko Hori; "Relocation" by Arthur Okusu.


