PAPER DRIVE STARTS

Acute Paper Shortage Emphasized

An all out salvage drive for waste paper will begin immediately.

Center residents are asked to save all paper including newspapers, boxes, magazines, and any paper materials. Rohwer Scouts will conduct the collection of the salvaged paper. According to the plan announced, each Tuesday morning residents will be asked to deliver

the paper to their block offices. Scouts will be on hand to help tie the paper into bundles or put it into boxes. On Tuesday afternoon a truck will call at each block and the Scouts will load the paper on the truck. On Wednesday morning the paper will be taken to McGehee where a purchaser will buy the paper at \$4 per ton. The money raised will go to the Scout fund.

Plans for the salvage paper project were made by a special committee appointed by Project Director Ray D. Johnston, the Community council and the Block managers. With William M. Beasley, principal of secondary schools as chairman, the Salvage paper drive committee is composed of Chester Fujino from the Community council; Mr. Hayashino and Mr. Ito, Block managers; Lloyd Shingu, Red Cross; Jerry Uchiyama, Rohwer Co-op; Dr. Nat Griswold and Kaz Ikebasu, CA; Col. Neil Snyder, Property control; C.V. Updegraff, Transporter.

FOREIGN PROPERTY OWNERS TO REGISTER

Evacuees who own any foreign bonds or other foreign securities, or have any bank deposits in a foreign country, or possess any other foreign property must file reports not later than June 15 with Project Attorney Jack Curtis. They are asked to see Curtis immediately and file a report on Treasury Department Form TFR-500, unless they already have reported on the forms or are exempt from reporting.

Any person, otherwise required to report is exempt if his foreign property on May 31, 1943 had a total value of less than \$10,000 measured by "cost or face value" or "market or estimated value", whichever is higher, but the exemption does not apply to foreign bonds payable in United States dollars, which must be reported regardless of value.

Form TFR-500 must not be confused with Form TFR-300, which many persons filed about two years ago. Filing of a report of Form TFR-300 does not excuse anyone from filing a report on Form TFR-500.

LOST ISSEI'S BODY FOUND

After a two day Center-wide manhunt, missing Henry Shuzo Fukuzawa, about 60 years old of 38-10-E, was found dead Thursday morning at 9:10 in a four-foot pool of water in the wooded area, northwest of the hospital.

Fukuzawa's body was found by a searching party of Masaichi Ito, 39-12-A and Ryoichi Kawamichi, 41-4-E. His death was caused by shock and drowning. He had been suffering from diabetes for some time.

Fukuzawa was a former steward of Mess hall 38. He was formerly of Los Angeles, and has no relatives here.

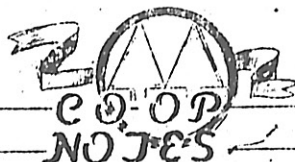
