## SHORT-TERM LEAVE

### New Regulations On Short Term Leave Announced

Effective immediately, the following revisions of the instructions covering short-term leave are being applied, E. B. Moulton, relocation officer, announced.

Short-term leave may not be issued for the purpose of looking for temporary employment, seasonal employment, or employment under indefinite leave trial period.

Short-term leave may be issued to permit an evacuee to be interviewed by a prospective employer, to look for permanent employment, or to investigate a relocation opportunity.

An applicant for short-term leave will receive a comprehensive interview in order to determine his relocation plan, the complete explanation for his application and a detailed itinerary of the proposed travel.

Short-term will ordinarily be granted to an applicant under 21 years of age only for the following reasons: 1. To accompany an older member of the immediate family; 2. When he is married and the head of a family and is following a relocation plan; 3. Where emergencies arise involving other members of the immediate family or where there are urgent business matters requiring his attention; 4. Where the individual has a relocation plan and is mature enough to carry out the plan; 5. Where he has been inducted into the armed forces.

## NISEI VOTERS ARE RESIDENTS OF PRE-EVACUATION STATES

California voting registrars or county clerks have refused, in some cases, to register evacuees on the grounds that there was insufficient evidence of their residence in the county, because the evacuees did not own or lease property there, it was reported.

Dillon S. Myer, WRA national director, pointed out that regardless of property interests, evacuees in relocation centers are still considered

to be domiciled in the states and counties from which they were evacuated and consequently have voting rights there.

The Project Attorney will discuss the case of any one who has been refused registration and if the attorney believes that the refusal was not justified, the case will be referred to the WRA San Francisco office and the matter will be taken up with the Attorney General of the state involved.

## EDUCATION FILMS TO BE SHOWN

The movies are: "Men's Greatest Friend," "Mechanism of Breathing," "The Perfect Setup," "Mickey's Nightmare."

## Festival King And Queen Contest Starts Next Week

Community-elected royalty will reign over the Rohwer Center Festival Week from July 3 to 8.

Nominations for a Festival King and Queen can be made at the CA office starting Monday until 5 p.m. on June 17. Contestants must be between 18 and 25 years of age. Votes for the candidates are attached to the raffle ticket stubs which will go on sale for 5 cents by the middle of next week. All votes after the 12 p.m. deadline on July 1 will be invalid.

## HEMP FACTORY WANTS WORKERS

Sadazo Umatsu, former civic leader of Rohwer who is now working for the War Hemp Industry, Inc., in Chicago, Ill., will be in the center Wednesday to recruit workers for the factory.

Offered to both men and women, jobs will pay from 60¢ to 70¢ per hour, averaging \$8 per day.

The sovereigns will be crowned at the Coronation Ball on July 3. A Festival Week proclamation by Project Director Rey D. Johnston and the Community Council will be made at the time.

## PAPER DRIVE: 4,600 MORE POUNDS TAKEN IN 2nd WEEK

In the second week of the Paper salvage drive, the Rohwer Boy Scouts collected 4,600 pounds of papers and magazines.

Because transportation facilities are needed for the transferring of Denson people, the Boy Scouts will not be able to pick up the paper for the coming two-week period. However, the Scouts will be around on Monday and Tuesday to bundle up the paper and magazines. Everyone's cooperation towards the Paper drive is well appreciated, the Salvage drive committees said.

# JAPAN DOESN'T WANT MOST OF REPATRIATES, MYER SAYS

SAN FRANCISCO--The War Relocation Authority disclosed on May 29 that the Japanese government doesn't want "most" of the segregees at the Tule Lake segregation camp who have requested repatriation to Japan, the Pacific Citizen reported on June 3.

The WRA indicated that more than half of the 19,000 segregees at Tule Lake, who are reputedly "disloyal," have requested repatriation.

Dillon S. Myer, WRA national director, told Congress recently that the Japanese government does not want most of the segregees. Persons acceptable to Tokyo include Japanese with money and young persons with college educations, Myer indicated. In some cases, Myer told the congressmen, Japan has tried to get young Japanese American college graduates who have refused repatriation or expatriation.

# PLATOON COMMANDER TRICE WRITES FROM CAMP DECATUR

Platoon Commander J. A. Trice, former superintendent of Roxbury schools who left the Center for the U. S. Navy in April, is now helping train new companies at the U. S. Navy Training Center in San Diego, Calif.

Trice's letter from camp Decatur follows in part:

"After three weeks of boot training, I was taken out and put in the School of the Platoon for two weeks of the most inten-

sive training a man could give or take. But I took it and made good grades, so now I am a Platoon Commander, striking for Specialist "A", Company Commander. It will take some time to get that but in the meantime I am helping to train new and incoming companies and as such occupy a respectable position. If I do well at it and if there are no changes in policy, I will go to school again in 90 days."
