

EMPLOYMENT ROUTINE APPLICANTS REGISTER NOW

Residents desiring employment in the Center are asked to observe the following routine by Joseph Coleman, assistant personnel officer in Ad. building 2.

1. All persons desiring employment must apply in person at the Personnel office in A. building 2.

2. All applicants will be called for interview and assignment by notice delivered to applicant's Center address.

3. Applicants will be referred for prospective employer's approval for key positions.

4. All persons are required to be properly assigned before reporting for duty. The assignment paper must be signed by employee and validated by the Placement officer.

5. Transfer of employees from Jerome to Rohwer will not be recognized. All employees of Jerome Center should be terminated prior to their removal to Rohwer. Those desiring employment in Rohwer will apply in the regular manner.

6. Persons presently employed are not eligible to apply for other employment.

7. Those who wish employment but have not finished high school will apply at the Vocational guidance department of the High school in Block 35.

8. Temporary residents or visitors at the Center are not eligible for employment.

9. All qualified applicants are called in the order that they are registered.

10. Persons returning to Center from indefinite leave must be readmitted into the Center before they are eligible for employment.


