

TRANSFER COMPLETED

With the arrival of the 309 post-contingent group yesterday, the Jerome to Rohwer transfer movement was completed. The final tabulation showed that 2,533 persons were moved during the seventeen day period.

The actual movement began on June 6 with 121 transferees. This was followed by 118 on June 7; 90 on the 8th; 223 on the 9th; 240 on the 10th; 151 on the 12th; 147 on the 13th; 212 on the 14th; 203 on the 15th; 190 on the 16th; 118 on the 20th; 120 on the 21st; 158 on the 22nd; 309 on the 23rd.

Prior to June 6, 133 persons moved in scattered groups into this Center.

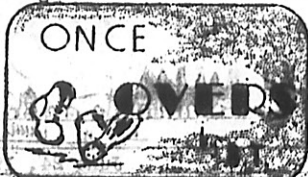
Nakao was a good student. He is survived by his mother and sister residing in Block 13.

This business of preparing leaves the center quite a job—even for someone who has experienced it once before. The whole thing starts out innocently enough at the leave office, where a girl prepares a form for you to take around to six or seven departments.

Your first stop is the ration desk in ad building two. Nothing tough there. So far so good. You walk over to the transportation section, and a girl makes out your routing for you. These gals always have an answer ready. They're never stumped, unless you happen to ask them the price of a one-way ticket to California.

Then, in quick order, you go to your employer, the timekeeper, and the payroll desk. Everything is going smoothly so far. There is nothing to it. Why, it's a breeze.

In this happy frame of mind, you walk to the welfare section in Block 42. You find the place in a turmoil. They have charge of the housing for incoming Jeromians, and do they have a headache! Eight people are waiting around, mostly with complaints of one sort or another about the housing. The welfare people listen to them patiently. You congratulate yourself that you're not a welfare worker. There, you say to yourself, but for the grace of God am I,

Then you ankle over to the public works, back of ad building one, where they check on your bedding. They hand you another form, which you are to take back to your block manager to be signed. You hurry back to your block and spend an hour looking for the manager. He signs the form, and you walk ten blocks across camp again in the broiling sun to the p.w.

Yep, this business of preparing to leave is a tough routine. My friend claims he wore out two pairs of shoes, though how probably exaggerating. I wore out only one pair. I hear that the Army is even interested in our relocation preparation routine. Somebody tipped off a colonel about it, and now he wants to try it out on his men at an eastern camp, where they are training to be Commandos.

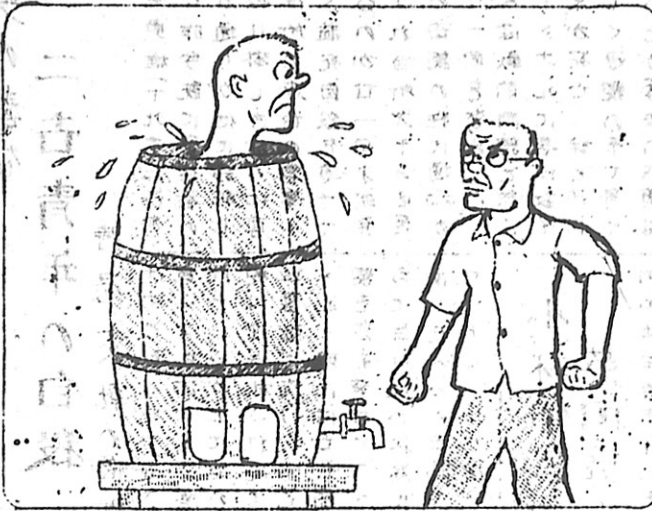
