## JOHNSTON ON DRAFT Residents Cautioned To Comply With Regulations

"It has been called to my attention that some of the Center residents have been negligent in complying with Selective Service regulations. In most cases this has involved failure to notify their boards of registration or their boards of transfer of changes of address or failure to return promptly questionnaires sent to them. Recently, one Center resident has been ordered to report for immediate induction, not soon as he is examined because he failed to notify the board of his new address," Project Director Ray D. Johnston stated.

"There also have been cases where those in the listed Reserve Corps have not taken the proper precautions to keep the army informed of new addresses.

"It is the individual responsibility of every person of draft age to comply with Selective Service and military regulations. Although WRA is glad to assist them in these matters, it is not our responsibility. I strongly recommend that more care be taken in this respect. It is especially important in cases where residents have left the Center that all notices concerning the army and Selective Service be forwarded to them at once by their families," he said.

## RESIDENTS WARNED OF CALIFORNIA INVESTIGATORS

In a letter to Dillard S. Myer, WRA national director, the National JACL headquarters called attention to investigations being made by the state of California on alien land violations. Investigators have interviewed Center residents on the pretense of checking over income tax returns and then prying into real estate dealings.

The JACL letter stated in part as follows:

"In view of the criminal elements involved, we believe that every resident who is to be interviewed should be informed that he cannot be compelled to testify or submit to any questioning by such investigators.

"Any violation of the alien land laws should be prosecuted. On the other hand, we believe that those who are prospective defendants to escheat or criminal proceedings should not be compelled to testify and thereby furnish the evidence for their prosecution under false pretenses on the part of the investigators of the State of California.

"All persons who are being interviewed on such matters should consult the project attorneys or a private attorney if residing in the 'free zone,' and the JACL press release.

## CO-OP TO CLOSE THURSDAY P M

## SEASONAL CONTRACT TO EXPIRE UPON INDUCTION

"Evacuees on seasonal leave will be released from their contracts by the War Food Administration when they receive notices to report for induction into the army," D. S. Myer, WRA director, announced. The War Food Administration has also agreed in cases of this kind to furnish transportation back to the project.

## BOY FATALLY HURT BY TRUCK

In the first fatal traffic accident of the Center an eight year boy, Daitaro Toyo of Block 9, was run over by a truck Thursday afternoon.

Apparently the boy, unknown to the driver, had climbed onto the truck. As the car started to back away, the boy jumped or fell off and was run over.

The unconscious boy was taken immediately to the hospital but he soon died of a head injury.

If induction notices are presented by the evacuee or if they are notified of the induction order by the project director:

Letters or telegrams from relatives of seasonal workers advising them of their notice of induction will not be accepted by WFA.
