FOOD RATIONS

WRA TO STORE PROPERTY OF RELOCATED EVACUEES, SOLDIERS

WRA will provide storage space for property left in the evacuated area or in a Center by an evacuee who either relocates or is inducted into the armed forces as long as West Coast exclusion remains in effect, according to word received from Washington by Project Director Ray D. Johnston.

The recently revised regulations further indicate that although WRA will assist in moving the household, personal and commercial property of evacuees going out on indefinite leave, it cannot assume responsibility for the storage or care of a relocated evacuee's property at the point of relocation. This includes property of evacuees who were inducted after relocation.

The revision also stipulates that an evacuee who has been inducted into the armed services, and who desires to have property he has left at the Center or on the West Coast stored for him by WRA should designate some person to represent him in dealing with the Authority.

DEFERMENT PROCEDURE FOR ESSENTIAL WORKS: 26- OVER

Dillon S. Myer, WRA director, has released steps to be taken by nisei over 26 years of age in essential work.

Any case brought to the attention of headquarters will be investigated but everything possible should be done first to straighten out the case with the local board.

The steps are: 1. The employee should send a request for deferment to the local board. 2. If within about ten days, no reply has been received from the local board, a second letter should be sent by registered mail, calling the attention of the board to the fact that the first

JEROME ADV. TAKES OVER

"The outlook on relocation at Rohwer is much better than it was in Jerome," was the compliment paid to residents of this Center by Young M. Orsburn, former relocation advisor of Jerome relocation center, who has been transferred to Rohwer to interview and counsel individuals and families, and to help them devise relocation plans. As relocation advisor here, he will also keep residents posted on current job offers on the outside.

communication has not been answered. 3. If the board continues to ignore the request and the induction of the nisei is ordered, an appeal should be filed with the board. This, also, should be sent by registered mail. 4. If the West Coast board complies with regulations, the case will then be referred to the board in the community where the evacuee is living. If it is not referred and the case is a worthy one, all facts concerning it should be sent at once to the Director of the WRA, Attention Reports Division. The matter will then be taken up with the National Selective Service Office.

New Rule Leaves Extra Points

Revision of WRA distribution regulations on rationed foods, as indicated in instructions received this week from Washington, are expected to provide additional benefit to Center residents.

Hereafter the quotas which are allotted for rationed foods during specific periods, but not actually used during those periods, may be carried over and used at a later time. As consumption of rationed foods drops off considerably during summer and fall months when Center-produced vegetables and fresh fruits are available, ration points accumulated during this time will be of substantial assistance in less productive months.

Revised OPA quotas for civilian consumption will now be in effect at the centers.

442 SPEARHEAD DRIVE IN ITALY

"The 442nd Regimental Combat Team composed of American soldiers of Japanese origin is participating in the Fifth Army's attack along the west coast sector of Italy toward the port of Leghorn," it was announced officially by an Associated Press Dispatch of July 10.

"This force with tank support smashed into enemy positions in the face of determined resistance," said an Allied spokesman. "Spearheading the assault was the 100th Battalion, a unit which has performed brilliantly throughout the entire Italian campaign," the dispatch stated.

CHARLESTON, West Va.
This is a southern state with a bit of northern flavor. West Virginia was one of the original southern states. But in recent years it has broken away from the tight-knit, southern political bloc and aligned itself with the northern. For instance, the state is much closer to Ohio than it is to Virginia, Kentucky, or Tennessee.

INFLUENCE

This conversion, while not radically changing the traditions of the aristocratic south, has, nevertheless, resulted in lowering some racial barriers. Negroes can ride the busses (Charleston has no streetcars) here without sitting in Jim Crow sections. Such a practice would be unthinkable in most parts of the south.

ENCOURAGING

Negroes are not allowed to eat in restaurants or soda fountains. Yet my first night here I took a young Negro minister into the Greyhound bus terminal, sat at the fountain, ordered cokes, and was served. Not an eyebrow was lifted, not a stare or a voice signified any protest by the other customers, employees, or the management. Next night we tried a drugstore fountain, and we were served promptly and pleasantly.

RECREATION

Negroes are not allowed to patronize the theaters and may only attend their own movie house. But here again local Negro and white leaders are working on the problem. Some sort of a compromise solution may be worked out one of these days, whereby Negroes will be admitted if they seek admittance but will be neither encouraged nor discouraged.

TWO NISEI HERE

There are two other nisei here besides myself (there are no isssei). Both are doctors at the Charles-

PLAYGROUND TO BE ERECTED

Under construction east of the Auditorium across from Block 20 is a children's playground.

Chinning bars, swings, slides, swinging rings and swing bars, partly donated by Camp Shelby soldiers, will be used principally by junior age children (12 years or under). CA staff members will be there to supervise from 8 to 11 a.m. and 6 to 8:30 p.m.

Two badminton and two volleyball courts exclusively for junior and senior girls will be within the playground. Croquet courts will also be made. Equipment will be loaned at the playground to the individual or group in charge.

RESIDENTS WARNED TO LEAVE MIGRATORY BIRDS ALONE

Center residents are cautioned by WRA against violating federal regulations covering the capture or killing of migratory birds.

Under provisions of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, it is a criminal offense to hunt, capture, kill, sell, buy or transport any migratory bird protected by treaties with Great Britain and Mexico. A list of such birds may be obtained from Project Attorney L. S. Forrest.

Officials of the Fish and Wildlife Service indicate that some Center evacuees have unknowingly captured birds protected under those treaties. The birds must be liberated immediately or evacuees possessing them will be subject to a fine up to \$500 and/or imprisonment up to six months, as provided by the Migratory Bird Act. Centricites are urged to take notice.

RESULT

Upshot of it all was that Dr. Riggleman, through pressure from various sources, was forced to withdraw his invitation to the nisei students. Before doing so, he wrote a bitter piece for the newspapers, decrying such ignorance and narrow-mindedness on the part of men so prominent and influential in local affairs. The nisei have a champion in Dr. Rig-

gleman, and my guess is that he isn't through yet.

FOREIGNER
I'm the first Japanese most of these people have ever seen, much less listened to or spoken with. Yesterday, after my talk at the Human Relations clinic, I stopped outside to find about 30 children waiting to have a look at me. Word had spread thru the neighborhood that a Japanese was here. One little boy was bolder than the rest. He asked: "How do you like the United States?" "Might be improved, son," I told him, seriously.
