## 442D REGIMENT ON ITALY FRONT GOES FOR BROKE

Built up from a single battalion to a full-sized regiment, Japanese American doughboys are back in the line operating against the Germans with the motto, "Go for broke," the crapshooter's equivalent of shoot the works or bet the roll, according to the Dayton (Ohio) Journal.

This is the 442nd regiment, complete with engineers and artillery, which was created by a special War Department order after Selective Service had refused to induct Americans of Japanese ancestry.

The first of these soldiers in action was the now-famous 100th battalion, which made the first actual contact with the enemy in Italy as part of the 34th

CHARLESTON, West Va.—There are ten Chinese living in Charleston. With the two nisei here (I'm merely a visitor), that makes only 12 Orientals in the city. I don't blame the people for looking at me with more than casual curiosity. I am definitely a novelty here.

#### BOX-OFFICE APPEAL

In fact, as one of my friends laughingly put it, I am Charleston's newest sideshow attraction. Little children in the neighborhood cluster around me, ask me for autographs or pennies, and follow me around. When I visit other neighborhoods, children point me out to their playmates or shouting announce my presence to others.

#### LITTLE FRIENDS

One little boy startled me the other day by yelling in a voice loud enough to carry the whole block: "Come on, Billy, and see a real, live, jen-you-wine Japanese." One little, three-year-old Italian girl ran into her home and hid in the closet. She timidly came outside later, however, and in no time at all, we were good friends. Of course, the plateful of ice cream and cake that I shared with her might have had something to do with that.

#### PEOPLE FRIENDLY

When I first arrived here, a Quaker friend told me that the city was very unresponsive to Japanese Americans. He was basing his conclusion on the incident which I related last week. However, I have found the people of Charleston to be very congenial and friendly. I have yet to encounter any unpleasant incidents or even tinges of unfavorableness in my amblings around the city.

#### CHICKEN

In fact, far from being unfriendly, the people are killing me with kindness

When I told him, he thought a moment and said: "Your folks must have come from the interior of China. I've never heard of that name before." I didn't tell him I was Japanese. It would have broken his heart.

Of the ten Chinese living here, five belong to one family, the only Chinese family in Charlston. They operate one of two Chinese restaurants in town. These Chinese have seen only two or three Japanese in their lives. So it was quite natural, when I walked into the Canton cafe for a bowl of pork heart.

(Continued from page 1) Hirata went to a ridge from which the Nazis had been firing.

After the shooting, the lead trio and their mates had run up a total of some 30 Nazi dead, 46 captured and had a collection of enemy material.

The regiment charged some 50 miles in four days

after going into the line. Some averaged as little as two and a half hours sleep a night, and some were so far out ahead of the supply lines they were without food for 24 hours.

The regiment's engineers have been the talk of the entire division of Yankees. They will tell you that one of the neatest mop-up

jobs was done by Lt. Walter Matsumoto, of Honolulu Corp. Tadashi Fujioka, Seattle W.H., and the crew headed by Sgt. Ted Tsukono, also of Seattle, after snipers got one of their sergeants west of Castellina. They dug the Jerrries out all over the hill, killed four, captured three, and chased the rest.
